SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/27-8.1

from Ch. 122, par. 27-8.1

Amends the School Code. Makes technical changes in a Section concerning health examinations and immunizations.

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AN ACT concerning education.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
27-8.1 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/27-8.1) (from Ch. 122, par. 27-8.1)

Sec. 27-8.1. Health examinations and immunizations.

8 (1) In compliance with rules and and regulations which the 9 Department of Public Health shall promulgate, and except as 10 hereinafter provided, all children in Illinois shall have a health examination as follows: within one year prior to 11 entering kindergarten or the first grade of any public, 12 private, or parochial elementary school; upon entering the 13 14 fifth and ninth grades of any public, private, or parochial school; prior to entrance into any public, private, or 15 16 parochial nursery school; and, irrespective of grade, 17 immediately prior to or upon entrance into any public, private, or parochial school or nursery school, each child shall present 18 proof of having been examined in accordance with this Section 19 20 and the rules and regulations promulgated hereunder.

A tuberculosis skin test screening shall be included as a required part of each health examination included under this Section if the child resides in an area designated by the Department of Public Health as having a high incidence of tuberculosis. Additional health examinations of pupils, including vision examinations, may be required when deemed necessary by school authorities. Parents are encouraged to have their children undergo vision examinations at the same points in time required for health examinations.

7 (1.5) In compliance with rules adopted by the Department of 8 Public Health and except as otherwise provided in this Section, 9 all children in kindergarten and the second and sixth grades of 10 any public, private, or parochial school shall have a dental 11 examination. Each of these children shall present proof of 12 having been examined by a dentist in accordance with this 13 Section and rules adopted under this Section before May 15th of 14 the school year. If a child in the second or sixth grade fails to present proof by May 15th, the school may hold the child's 15 16 report card until one of the following occurs: (i) the child 17 presents proof of a completed dental examination or (ii) the child presents proof that a dental examination will take place 18 19 within 60 days after May 15th. The Department of Public Health 20 shall establish, by rule, a waiver for children who show an undue burden or a lack of access to a dentist. Each public, 21 22 private, and parochial school must give notice of this dental 23 examination requirement to the parents and quardians of students at least 60 days before May 15th of each school year. 24

(2) The Department of Public Health shall promulgate rulesand regulations specifying the examinations and procedures

that constitute a health examination, which shall include the 1 2 collection of data relating to obesity $_{\boldsymbol{\tau}}$ (including at a 3 minimum, date of birth, gender, height, weight, blood pressure, and date of exam), and a dental examination and may recommend 4 5 by rule that certain additional examinations be performed. The rules and regulations of the Department of Public Health shall 6 specify that a tuberculosis skin test screening shall be 7 8 included as a required part of each health examination included 9 under this Section if the child resides in an area designated 10 by the Department of Public Health as having a high incidence 11 of tuberculosis. The Department of Public Health shall specify 12 that a diabetes screening as defined by rule shall be included as a required part of each health examination. Diabetes testing 13 14 is not required.

Physicians licensed to practice medicine in all of its 15 16 branches, advanced practice nurses who have a written 17 collaborative agreement with a collaborating physician which authorizes them to perform health examinations, or physician 18 assistants who have been delegated the performance of health 19 20 examinations by their supervising physician shall be 21 responsible for the performance of the health examinations, 22 other than dental examinations and vision and hearing 23 screening, and shall sign all report forms required by 24 subsection (4) of this Section that pertain to those portions 25 of the health examination for which the physician, advanced 26 practice nurse, or physician assistant is responsible. If a

registered nurse performs any part of a health examination, 1 2 then a physician licensed to practice medicine in all of its 3 branches must review and sign all required report forms. Licensed dentists shall perform all dental examinations and 4 5 shall sign all report forms required by subsection (4) of this 6 Section that pertain to the dental examinations. Physicians 7 licensed to practice medicine in all its branches, or licensed 8 optometrists, shall perform all vision exams required by school 9 authorities and shall sign all report forms required by 10 subsection (4) of this Section that pertain to the vision exam. 11 Vision and hearing screening tests, which shall not be 12 considered examinations as that term is used in this Section, 13 shall be conducted in accordance with rules and regulations of the Department of Public Health, and by individuals whom the 14 15 Department of Public Health has certified. In these rules and 16 regulations, the Department of Public Health shall require that 17 individuals conducting vision screening tests give a child's parent or guardian written notification, before the vision 18 screening is conducted, that states, "Vision screening is not a 19 20 substitute for a complete eye and vision evaluation by an eye doctor. Your child is not required to undergo this vision 21 22 screening if an optometrist or ophthalmologist has completed 23 and signed a report form indicating that an examination has been administered within the previous 12 months." 24

(3) Every child shall, at or about the same time as he orshe receives a health examination required by subsection (1) of

this Section, present to the local school proof of having received such immunizations against preventable communicable diseases as the Department of Public Health shall require by rules and regulations promulgated pursuant to this Section and the Communicable Disease Prevention Act.

(4) The individuals conducting the health examination or 6 dental examination shall record the fact of having conducted 7 8 the examination, and such additional information as required, 9 including for a health examination data relating to obesity, 10 (including at a minimum, date of birth, gender, height, weight, 11 blood pressure, and date of exam), on uniform forms which the 12 Department of Public Health and the State Board of Education shall prescribe for statewide use. The examiner shall summarize 13 14 on the report form any condition that he or she suspects indicates a need for special services, including for a health 15 16 examination factors relating to obesity. The individuals 17 confirming the administration of required immunizations shall record as indicated on the form that the immunizations were 18 19 administered.

(5) If a child does not submit proof of having had either the health examination or the immunization as required, then the child shall be examined or receive the immunization, as the case may be, and present proof by October 15 of the current school year, or by an earlier date of the current school year established by a school district. To establish a date before October 15 of the current school year for the health

examination or immunization as required, a school district must 1 2 give notice of the requirements of this Section 60 days prior to the earlier established date. If for medical reasons one or 3 more of the required immunizations must be given after October 4 5 15 of the current school year, or after an earlier established date of the current school year, then the child shall present, 6 7 by October 15, or by the earlier established date, a schedule for the administration of the immunizations and a statement of 8 9 the medical reasons causing the delay, both the schedule and 10 the statement being issued by the physician, advanced practice 11 nurse, physician assistant, registered nurse, or local health 12 department that will be responsible for administration of the 13 remaining required immunizations. If a child does not comply by October 15, or by the earlier established date of the current 14 15 school year, with the requirements of this subsection, then the 16 local school authority shall exclude that child from school 17 until such time as the child presents proof of having had the health examination as required and presents proof of having 18 received those required immunizations which are medically 19 20 possible to receive immediately. During a child's exclusion from school for noncompliance with this subsection, the child's 21 22 parents or legal guardian shall be considered in violation of 23 Section 26-1 and subject to any penalty imposed by Section 26-10. This (5) does 24 subsection not apply to dental examinations. 25

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(6) Every school shall report to the State Board of

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Education by November 15, in the manner which that agency shall 1 2 require, the number of children who have received the necessary immunizations and the health examination (other than a dental 3 examination) as required, indicating, of those who have not 4 5 received the immunizations and examination as required, the number of children who are exempt from health examination and 6 immunization requirements on religious or medical grounds as 7 8 provided in subsection (8). Every school shall report to the 9 State Board of Education by June 30, in the manner that the 10 State Board requires, the number of children who have received 11 the required dental examination, indicating, of those who have 12 not received the required dental examination, the number of 13 children who are exempt from the dental examination on 14 religious grounds as provided in subsection (8) of this Section and the number of children who have received a waiver under 15 16 subsection (1.5) of this Section. This reported information 17 shall be provided to the Department of Public Health by the State Board of Education. 18

(7) Upon determining that the number of pupils who are 19 20 required to be in compliance with subsection (5) of this Section is below 90% of the number of pupils enrolled in the 21 22 school district, 10% of each State aid payment made pursuant to 23 Section 18-8.05 to the school district for such year shall be withheld by the regional superintendent until the number of 24 25 students in compliance with subsection (5) is the applicable 26 specified percentage or higher.

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(8) Parents or legal guardians who object to health or 1 2 dental examinations or any part thereof, or to immunizations, on religious grounds shall not be required to submit their 3 children or wards to the examinations or immunizations to which 4 5 they so object if such parents or legal guardians present to 6 the appropriate local school authority a signed statement of 7 objection, detailing the grounds for the objection. If the 8 physical condition of the child is such that any one or more of 9 the immunizing agents should not be administered, the examining 10 physician, advanced practice nurse, or physician assistant 11 responsible for the performance of the health examination shall 12 endorse that fact upon the health examination form. Exempting a 13 child from the health or dental examination does not exempt the 14 child from participation in the program of physical education training provided in Sections 27-5 through 27-7 of this Code. 15

16 (9) For the purposes of this Section, "nursery schools" 17 means those nursery schools operated by elementary school 18 systems or secondary level school units or institutions of 19 higher learning.
