1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 1110

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend Senate Bill 1110 by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "ARTICLE 5
5 ILLINOIS STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

6 Section 5. In addition to any other amounts appropriated
7 for such purpose, the amount of \$44,386,800, or so much
8 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
9 Education Assistance Fund to the Illinois State Board of
10 Education for Early Childhood Education for the fiscal year
11 beginning July 1, 2007.

12 Section 10. In addition to any other amounts
13 appropriated for such purpose, the amount of \$259,764,700, or

1 so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
 2 Education Assistance Fund to the Illinois State Board of
 3 Education for General State Aid for the fiscal year beginning
 4 July 1, 2007.

5 Total, Article 5 \$304,151,500

6 ARTICLE 15

7 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

8 Section 10. The amount of \$2,612,500 is appropriated
 9 from the Capital Development Fund to the Department of
 10 Agriculture for deposit into the Conservation 2000 Projects
 11 Fund.

12 Section 20. No contract shall be entered into or
 13 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations
 14 in Section 10 of this Article until after the purposes and
 15 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

17 ARTICLE 25

18 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

1 Section 10. The sum of \$77,500,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Coal
3 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
4 Opportunity for all costs associated with the capital
5 development of coal gasification plants.

6 Section 15. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
8 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
9 Opportunity for costs related to preliminary planning,
10 design, and engineering of a pipeline to transport carbon
11 dioxide produced at coal gasification facilities for storage
12 underground.

13 Section 20. The sum of \$100,000,000, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
15 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
16 Opportunity for grants, loans, and investments or other
17 economic development activities associated with the Illinois
18 Community Assets Fund initiative or other economic
19 development activities.

20 Section 25. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
22 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

1 Opportunity for all costs associated with the capital
2 development and construction of biodiesel production
3 facilities.

4 Section 30. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof
5 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
6 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
7 Opportunity for a grant to Fermi National Accelerator
8 Laboratory for the Illinois Accelerator Research Center.

9 Section 35. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof
10 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
11 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
12 Opportunity for a grant to Argonne National Laboratory for
13 the Advanced Protein Crystallization Facility.

14 Section 40. The sum of \$60,000,000, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
16 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
17 Opportunity for a grant to University of Illinois at
18 Urbana/Champaign for all costs associated with design and
19 construction of a Petascale Computing Facility.

20 Section 45. The sum of \$490,000, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois

1 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
2 Opportunity for a grant to University of Illinois at Chicago
3 for all costs associated with planning campus improvements.

4 Section 50. The sum of \$20,000,000, or so much thereof
5 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
6 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
7 Opportunity for grants associated with the capital
8 development of new ethanol production facilities.

9 Section 55. The sum of \$6,000,000, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
11 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
12 Opportunity for grants associated with adding new E-85 fuel
13 pumps across that state.

14 Section 60. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
16 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
17 Opportunity for all costs associated with loans to small
18 businesses and manufacturers for energy efficiency
19 investments.

20 Section 65. The sum of \$400,000,000, or so much thereof
21 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois

1 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
 2 Opportunity for the purpose of making grants and loans to
 3 local governments for planning, engineering, acquisition,
 4 construction, reconstruction, development, improvement and
 5 extension of the public infrastructure, and for any other
 6 purposes authorized in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the
 7 Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for
 8 such purposes.

9 Section 70. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much
 10 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
 11 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
 12 Opportunity for grants to local governments for capital
 13 improvements to civic centers for the projects hereinafter
 14 enumerated:

1 Governor.

4 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

5 Section 45. The sum of \$8,093,204, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
8 made in Article 96, Section 45 of Public Act 94-798, is
9 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
10 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
11 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or
12 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

13 Section 50. The sum of \$3,130,040, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
15 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
16 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 50 of Public Act
17 94-798, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
18 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
19 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
20 Article 8 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

1 Section 55. The sum of \$2,600,251, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

17 Section 65. The sum of \$5,524,172, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
19 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
20 made in Article 96, Section 65 of Public Act 94-798, is
21 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
22 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
23 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or

1 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

2 Section 90. The sum of \$249,979,037, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
4 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
5 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 90 of Public Act
6 94-798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
7 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
8 the purpose of making grants and loans to local governments
9 for planning, engineering, acquisition, construction,
10 reconstruction, development, improvement and extension of the
11 public infrastructure, and for any other purposes authorized
12 in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
13 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

14 Section 95. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
16 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
17 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 95 of Public Act
18 94-798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
19 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
20 the purpose of fostering economic development and increased
21 employment and the well being of the citizens of Illinois,
22 and for any other purposes authorized in subsection (b) of
23 Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to

1 State agencies for such purposes.

2 Section 100. The sum of \$48,585,959, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
4 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
5 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 100 of Public
6 Act 94-798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
7 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
8 for the development and improvement of educational,
9 scientific, technical and vocational programs and facilities
10 and the expansion of health and human services, and for any
11 other purposes authorized in subsection (c) of Section 4 of
12 the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies
13 for such purposes.

14 Section 105. The sum of \$30,000,000, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
16 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
17 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 105 of Public
18 Act 94-798, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
19 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
20 for open spaces, recreational and conservation purposes and
21 the protection of land and for deposits into the Conservation
22 2000 Projects Fund as authorized by subsection (c) of Section
23 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State

1 agencies for such purposes.

2 Section 110. The sum of \$40,843,544, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
4 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
5 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 110 of Public
6 Act 94-798, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
7 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
8 for grants to local governments for the acquisition,
9 financing, architectural planning, development, alteration,
10 installation, and construction of capital facilities
11 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
12 land as authorized by subsection (1) of Section 3 of the
13 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies
14 for such purposes.

15 Section 155. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much
16 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
17 close of business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation
18 heretofore made in Article 95, Section 45 of Public Act 94-
19 798, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
20 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
21 grants pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9, or
22 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

23 Section 170. The sum of \$27,662,869, or so much thereof

1 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
2 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
3 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 115 of Public
4 Act 94-0798, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois'
5 Future to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
6 for grants to units of government, educational facilities and
7 not-for-profit organizations for education and training,
8 infrastructure improvements and other capital projects
9 including but not limited to planning, construction,
10 reconstruction, equipment, utilities and vehicles, and all
11 costs associated with economic development programs,
12 community service programs, public health programs, public
13 safety programs, other programs and activities, and for
14 grants to other State agencies for any capital or operating
15 purposes.

17 Section 175. No contract shall be entered into or
18 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
19 appropriation herein made in this Article, until after the
20 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
21 Governor.

1 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

2 GRANTS AND REIMBURSEMENTS - GENERAL OFFICE

3 Section 175. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof
4 as may be necessary is appropriated from the Capital
5 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
6 the non-federal cost share of a Conservation Reserve
7 Enhancement Program to establish long-term contracts and
8 permanent conservation easements in the Illinois River Basin;
9 to fund cost-share assistance to landowners to encourage
10 approved conservation practices in environmentally sensitive
11 and highly erodible areas of the Illinois River Basin; and to
12 fund the monitoring of long term improvements of these
13 conservation practices as required in the Memorandum of
14 Agreement between the State of Illinois and the United State
15 Department of Agriculture.

16 Section 180. The sum of \$7,800,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
18 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
19 expenditure by the Office of Water Resources for water
20 development projects at the approximate cost set forth below:

1 needed at State-owned Dams for upgrading and rehabilitation
2 of dams, spillways and supporting facilities, including dam
3 removals and the required geotechnical investigations,
4 preparation of plans and specifications, and the construction
5 of the proposed rehabilitation to ensure reduced risk of
6 injury to the public.

7 Section 190. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary is appropriated from the Capital
9 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
10 planning, design and construction of ecosystem
11 rehabilitation, habitat restoration and associated
12 development in cooperation with the U.S. Army Corps of
13 Engineers.

15 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from

1 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

2 Section 5. The sum of \$750,000,000, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary, for statewide use pursuant to Section
4 4(a)(1) of the General Obligation Bond Act, is appropriated
5 from the Transportation Bond Series A Fund to the Department
6 of Transportation for land acquisition, engineering
7 (including environmental studies and archaeological
8 activities and other studies and activities necessary or
9 appropriate to secure federal participation in the project),
10 and construction, including reconstruction, extension and
11 improvement of State highways, arterial highways, roads,
12 structures separating highways and railroads and bridges and
13 for purposes allowed or required by Title 23 of the U.S. Code
14 as provided by law in order to implement a portion of the
15 Fiscal Year 2008 road improvements program.

16 Section 10. The sum of \$250,000,000, or so much thereof
17 as may be necessary, pursuant to Section 4(a) of the Build
18 Illinois Bond Act is appropriated from the Build Illinois
19 Bond Fund to the Department of Transportation for planning,
20 engineering, acquisition, construction, reconstruction,
21 development, improvement, extension, and all construction
22 related expenses of the public infrastructure and other
23 transportation improvement projects which are related to

1 economic development in the State of Illinois.

2

3 Section 12. The sum of \$250,000,000, or so much thereof
 4 as may be necessary, pursuant to Section 4(a) of the Build
 5 Illinois Bond Act is appropriated from the Build Illinois
 6 Bond Fund to the Department of Transportation for grants to
 7 counties, municipalities, and road districts for planning,
 8 engineering, acquisition, construction, reconstruction,
 9 development, improvement, extension, and all construction
 10 related expenses of the public infrastructure and other
 11 transportation improvement projects which are related to
 12 economic development in the State of Illinois allocated as
 13 follows:

14	For the municipalities of the state	122,750,000
15	For the counties of the state having	
16	1,000,000 or more inhabitants	41,850,000
17	For the counties of the having less	
18	than 1,000,000 inhabitants	45,675,000

20 Section 15. The sum of \$25,000,000, or so much thereof
 21 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Transportation
 22 Bond Series B Fund to the Department of Transportation for
 23 financial assistance to airports pursuant to Section 34 of
 24 the Illinois Aeronautics Act, as amended, for such purposes

1 as are described in that Section and for airport acquisition
2 and development pursuant to Section 72 of the Illinois
3 Aeronautics Act, as amended, for such purposes as are
4 described in that Section.

5 Section 20. The sum of \$200,000,000, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Transportation
7 Bond Series B Fund to the Department of Transportation for
8 construction costs, making grants, and providing project
9 assistance to municipalities, special transportation
10 districts, private non-profit carriers, mass transportation
11 carriers and the Intercity rail program for the acquisition,
12 construction, extension, reconstruction, and improvement of
13 mass transportation facilities, including rapid transit,
14 intercity rail, bus and other equipment used in connection
15 therewith, as provided by law, pursuant to Section 4(b)(1) of
16 the General Obligation Bond Act, as amended. Prior to the
17 release of the appropriated funds described above, the
18 Regional Transportation Authority shall submit a capital
19 program to the Governor that reflects the system needs and
20 project types in the following order:

- 21 (1) Projects designed to maintain existing system;
- 22 (2) Projects with the goal of enhancing the existing system;
- 23 and
- 24 (3) Projects designed to expand the existing system.

1 Upon determination by the Governor or appointed delegate that
2 the submitted capital program reflects the prioritization
3 described above, the Governor shall release said funds to the
4 Department of Transportation for subsequent availability to
5 the Regional Transportation Authority.

6
7 Section 25. An amount equal to \$200,000,000, or so much
8 of that amount as may be necessary, payable solely from
9 transfers from the State Gaming Fund to the General Revenue
10 Fund pursuant to subsection (b-2) of Section 13 of the
11 Riverboat and Casino Gambling Act is appropriated from the
12 General Revenue Fund to the Department of Transportation for
13 operating assistance grants to the Regional Transportation
14 Authority and its Service Boards if and only if House Bill
15 2035 becomes law.

16 Section 35. In addition to any other amounts
17 appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, an
18 amount equal to \$20,000,000, or so much of that amount as may
19 be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
20 to the Department of Transportation from transfers from the
21 State Gaming Fund to the General Revenue Fund pursuant to
22 subsection (b-2) of Section 13 of the Riverboat and Casino
23 Gambling Act, if and only if House Bill 2035 becomes law, for

1 operating assistance and capital grants to carriers
2 enumerated in Article 360, Section 255 of Public Act 95-0348,
3 allocated to each carrier in proportion to the amount
4 appropriated to each carrier of the total amount appropriated
5 under Article 360, Section 255 of Public Act 95-0348.

6 Section 45. In addition to any other amounts
7 appropriated for such purpose for the fiscal year beginning
8 July 1, 2007, the sum of \$4,000,000 is appropriated from the
9 General Revenue Fund to the Department of Transportation from
10 transfers from the State Gaming Fund to the General Revenue
11 Fund pursuant to subsection (b-2) of Section 13 of the
12 Riverboat and Casino Gambling Act, if and only if House Bill
13 2035 becomes law, for operating assistance and capital grants
14 to the Madison County Mass Transit District.

15 Section 55. In addition to any other amounts
16 appropriated for such purpose for the fiscal year beginning
17 July 1, 2007, the amount of \$5,800,000 is appropriated from
18 the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Transportation
19 from transfers from the State Gaming Fund to the General
20 Revenue Fund pursuant to subsection (b-2) of Section 13 of
21 the Riverboat and Casino Gambling Act, if and only if House
22 Bill 2035 becomes law, for operating assistance and capital
23 grants for public transportation services to Bond County;

1 Bureau County, Coles County; Edgar County; Stephenson County
2 and the City of Freeport; Henry County; Jo Daviess County;
3 Kankakee and McLean Counties; Peoria County, Piatt County,
4 Shelby County, Tazewell and Woodford Counties; Vermillion
5 County; Williamson County; and Kendall County.

6 Section 60. The sum of \$100,000,000, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Transportation
8 Bond Series B Fund to the Department of Transportation,
9 pursuant to Section 4(b)(1) of the General Obligation Bond
10 Act, for track and signal improvements, AMTRAK station
11 improvements, rail passenger equipment, and rail freight
12 facility improvements.

14 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from an
