Amends the Environmental Protection Act. Makes a technical change to a Section concerning alternative control strategies.

1 AN ACT concerning safety.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Environmental Protection Act is amended by changing Section 9.3 as follows:
- 6 (415 ILCS 5/9.3) (from Ch. 111 1/2, par. 1009.3)
- 7 Sec. 9.3. Alternative control strategies.
- (a) The The General Assembly finds that control strategies, 8 9 including emission limitations, alternative environmentally equivalent to those required 10 by regulations or the terms of this Act, can assure equivalent 11 protection of the environment and that the use of such 12 13 alternative control strategies can encourage technological
- innovation, reduce the likelihood of shutdown of older sources,
- and can result in decreased costs of compliance and increased
- 16 availability of resources for use in productive capital
- investments.
- 18 (b) (Blank.)
- 19 (c) On or before December 31, 1982, the Board shall adopt
- 20 regulations establishing a permit program pursuant to Section
- 21 39.1 in accordance with Title VII of this Act.
- 22 (d) Board rules pursuant to this Section 9.3 shall set
- forth reasonable requirements for issuance of an alternative

control strategy permit, provided that the Board may not impose any condition or requirement more stringent than required by the Clean Air Act or for compliance with this Act or other Board regulations thereunder. The Agency shall promptly adopt any necessary procedures for the administration of such permit programs. The burden of establishing that any procedure, condition or requirement imposed by the Agency in or for the issuance of a permit is more stringent than required by applicable law shall be upon the permit applicant.
