Amends the Voluntary Payroll Deductions Act of 1983. Permits State employees and annuitants to authorize payroll deductions for Illinois income tax checkoff charitable funds. Effective immediately.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Voluntary Payroll Deductions Act of 1983 is
amended by adding Section 9 as follows:

7 <u>Sec. 9. Charitable funds contributions.</u>
8 <u>(a) As used in this Section:</u>
9 <u>"Combined appeal" means the State and Universities</u>
10 Employees Combined Appeal as defined in this Act.

- 11"Individual income tax return" has the same meaning as12in the Illinois Income Tax Act.
- 13 <u>"State charitable fund" means any fund that shall have</u> 14 <u>qualified for inclusion for checkoff donations on the</u> 15 <u>individual income tax returns as described in Sections 507</u> 16 <u>through 510 of the Illinois Income Tax Act.</u>

17 (b) A State employee or annuitant may authorize the 18 withholding of a portion of his or her salary or wages for 19 contribution to any State charitable fund as part of the 20 combined appeal.

21 <u>Only those State charitable funds that shall qualify for</u> 22 <u>continued inclusion on the individual income tax returns under</u> 23 Section 509 of the Illinois Income Tax Act shall be eligible
