Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented 2 in the General Assembly: 3

ARTICLE 1 4

OFFICE OF THE ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

The amount of \$3,883, or so much of this 6 Section 5. 7 amount as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose 8 in Section 5 of Article 92 of Public Act 94-798, 9 is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the 10 Office of the Architect 11 of the Capitol for plans, 12 specifications, and continuation of work pursuant to the report and recommendations of the architectural, structural, 13 and mechanical surveys of the State Capitol Building. This is 14 for the continuation of the rehabilitation of the Capitol 15 Building. 16

17 Section 10. The sum of \$587,367, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of 18 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore 19 made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 92 of Public 20

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Act 94-798, is reappropriated from the Capital Development 1 Fund to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol for 2 remodeling, planning, relocation, permanent equipment, 3 and expenses, including architectural related 4 other and engineering fees associated with construction, 5 for the 6 remodeling of office space and other support areas under the jurisdiction of the House of Representatives and the Senate. 7

8 Section 15. No contract shall be entered into or 9 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations 10 in Section 5 and 10 of this Article until after the purposes 11 and amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.
