Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented 2 in the General Assembly: 3

4 ARTICLE 1

Section 5. 23	Section 20. The amounts appropriated for repairs and
24	maintenance, and other capital improvements in Section 15 for

- 1 repairs and maintenance, roof repairs and/or replacements and
- 2 miscellaneous capital improvements at the Department's
- 3 various institutions are to include construction,
- 4 reconstruction, improvements, repairs and installation of
- 5 capital facilities, costs of planning, supplies, materials
- and all other expenses required for roof and other types of
- 7 repairs and maintenance, capital improvements, and purchase
- 8 of land.
- 9 No contract shall be entered into or obligation incurred
- 10 for repairs and maintenance and other capital improvements
- 11 from appropriations made in Section 15 of this Article until
- 12 after the purpose and amounts have been approved in writing
- 13 by the Governor.
- 14 Section 25. The sum of \$489,800, or so much thereof as
- 15 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
- 16 Juvenile Justice from the General Revenue Fund for costs and
- 17 expenses associated with payment of statewide
- 18 hospitalization.
- 19 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
- 20 2007.
