8 (a) Any person of the age 18 years and upwards who 9 intentionally or knowingly, and without legal justification 10 and by any means, causes great bodily harm or permanent 11 disability or disfigurement to any child under the age of 13 12 years or to any severely or profoundly mentally retarded 13 person, commits the offense of aggravated battery of a child.

14 <u>(a-5) Any person of the age 18 years and upwards who</u> 15 <u>intentionally or knowingly, and without legal justification</u> 16 <u>and by any means, causes bodily harm or disability or</u> 17 <u>disfigurement to any child under the age of 13 years or to any</u> 18 <u>severely or profoundly mentally retarded person, commits the</u> 19 offense of aggravated battery of a child.

(b) <u>Sentence.</u>

(1) Aggravated battery of a child <u>under subsection (a) of</u>
 this Section is a Class X felony, except that:

with a firearm, 15 years shall be added to the term of
 imprisonment imposed by the court;

3 <u>(B)</u> <del>(2)</del> if, during the commission of the offense, the 4 person personally discharged a firearm, 20 years shall be 5 added to the term of imprisonment imposed by the court;

6 <u>(C)</u> (3) if, during the commission of the offense, the 7 person personally discharged a firearm that proximately 8 caused great bodily harm, permanent disability, permanent 9 disfigurement, or death to another person, 25 years or up 10 to a term of natural life shall be added to the term of 11 imprisonment imposed by the court.

12 (2) Aggravated battery of a child under subsection (a-5) of
 13 this Section is a Class 3 felony.
