SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Makes appropriations from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Human Services: to fund an increase paid to private sector agencies serving individuals who need addiction treatment services; to fund a full 6% cost-of-doing-business increase paid to private sector agencies who deliver addiction prevention services; and for eliminating statewide waiting lists in connection with addiction treatment services and expanding capacity in the addiction prevention system. Effective July 1, 2008.

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 5. In addition to any amounts previously appropriated for that purpose, the sum of \$15,600,000, or so 5 much of that amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from 6 the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Human Services, 7 Division of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse, to fund a full 6% 8 9 cost-of-doing-business increase paid to private agencies serving individuals who need addiction treatment 10 11 services.

Section 10. In addition to any amounts previously appropriated for that purpose, the sum of \$1,850,000, or so much of that amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Human Services, Division of Community Health and Prevention, to fund a full 6% cost-of-doing-business increase paid to private sector agencies who deliver addiction prevention services.

Section 15. The sum of \$24,000,000, or so much of that amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Human Services for the

- 2 (1) To eliminate statewide waiting list for addiction
- 3 treatment services, \$17,200,000.
- 4 (2) To eliminate statewide waiting list for Medicaid-eligible
- 5 persons in need of addiction treatment services, \$3,400,000.
- 6 (3) To expand capacity in the addiction prevention system,
- 7 \$3,400,000.
- 8 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
- 9 2008.
