WHEREAS, Ms. Kreiman was a founding board member of the Warren Cherry Scholarship Fund, providing college scholarships to students; and

WHEREAS, Alice Kreiman is survived by her husband, Jerry; her son, David (Kate); her daughters, Deborah (Marvin) Talsky and Lisa Gendel; her grandchildren, Jessie, Charlie, and Sydney Kreiman, Naomi Talsky, and Taylor and Jordyn Gendel; therefore, be it
