SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

New Act

Creates the Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome Education Act. Provides that the Department of Public Health, subject to appropriation, shall establish the Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome Education Program to promote public awareness of the syndrome and the importance of early detection, diagnosis, and treatment. Provides that the Department shall work with health care providers, local public health agencies, and other appropriate agencies to coordinate and promote professional education programs. Provides that the Department may accept gifts, grants, and donations from any source for the purposes of carrying out its duties under the Act.

1 AN ACT concerning health.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the Reflex
Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome Education Act.

6 Section 5. Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome Education
7 Program.

8 (a) In this Act, "syndrome" means Reflex Sympathetic 9 Dystrophy Syndrome, a chronic neurologic syndrome of unknown 10 etiology characterized by severe burning pain, pathological 11 changes in bone and skin, tissue swelling, and extreme 12 sensitivity to touch that, if untreated, results in permanent 13 deformity and chronic pain.

14 (b) Department of Public Health, subject The to establish 15 appropriation, shall the Reflex Sympathetic 16 Dystrophy Syndrome Education Program to promote public 17 of the syndrome and the awareness importance of early detection, diagnosis, and treatment. 18

19 (c) The program shall promote public awareness of the 20 through written materials and other syndrome forms of 21 communication designed to provide education about the 22 syndrome. The program shall distribute information that includes: 23

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1 (1) the nature and possible causes of the syndrome;

2 (2) risk factors that may contribute to the
3 manifestation of the syndrome;

4 (3) available treatment options, including the risks
5 and benefits of treatment; and

6 (4) the availability of diagnostic, treatment, and 7 support services in this State.

8 (d) The Department shall work with health care providers, 9 local public health agencies, and other appropriate agencies to 10 coordinate and promote professional education programs that 11 will educate health care professionals about:

- 12 (1) current research about the syndrome;
- 13 (2) the nature of the syndrome;
- 14

(3) diagnostic procedures;

15 (4) medical and surgical treatment options; and

16 (5) the availability of diagnostic, treatment, and
 17 support services in Illinois communities.

(e) The Department may accept gifts, grants, and donations
from any source for the purposes of carrying out its duties
under this Act.
