1 AN ACT concerning health.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the MRSA
- 5 Prevention, Control, and Reporting Act.
- In this Act, "State residential 6 Section 5. Definition. facility" or "facility" means: any Department of Human Services 7 operated residential facility, including any State mental 8 9 health hospital, State developmental center, or residential school for the deaf and visually impaired; any 10 Department of Corrections operated correctional center, work 11 camp or boot camp; and any Department of Juvenile Justice 12 13 operated juvenile center or boot camp.
- Section 10. MRSA prevention, control, and reporting. In order to improve the prevention of infections due to methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus ("MRSA"), the following MRSA prevention, control, and reporting activities are applicable to State residential facilities:
- 19 (1) Guidelines. State residential facilities shall
 20 develop and utilize policies and procedures for MRSA
 21 prevention, control, and reporting that are in compliance
 22 with federal guidelines and consistent with the

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- operational needs of affected agencies.
- (2) Minimum standards. Procedural MRSA Prevention and 2 3 Control Guidelines shall include, but not be limited to, recommendations and requirements for screening surveillance, education and training, hygiene, sanitation, and infection control. 6
 - (3) Reporting. State residential facilities shall comply with Department of Public Health rules and regulations for reporting of communicable diseases, including MRSA.
- 11 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 12 becoming law.
