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1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 312

2 AMENDMENT NO. \_\_\_\_\_. Amend House Bill 312, AS AMENDED, by  
3 deleting everything after the enacting clause and inserting  
4 in lieu thereof with the following:

5 "ARTICLE 5  
6 ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

7 Section 5. The amount of \$3,883, or so much of this  
8 amount as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30,  
9 2009, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose  
10 in Section 5 of Article 27 of Public Act 95-734, is  
11 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the  
12 Office of the Architect of the Capitol for plans,  
13 specifications, and continuation of work pursuant to the  
14 report and recommendations of the architectural, structural,

1 and mechanical surveys of the State Capitol Building. This is  
2 for the continuation of the rehabilitation of the Capitol  
3 Building.

4 Section 10. The sum of \$553,641, or so much thereof as  
5 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
6 business on June 30, 2009, from a reappropriation heretofore  
7 made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 27 of Public  
8 Act 95-734, is reappropriated from the Capital Development  
9 Fund to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol for  
10 remodeling, planning, relocation, permanent equipment, and  
11 other related expenses, including architectural and  
12 engineering fees associated with construction, for the  
13 remodeling of office space and other support areas under the  
14 jurisdiction of the House of Representatives and the Senate.

15 Section 15. No contract shall be entered into or  
16 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations  
17 in Sections 5 and 10 of this Article until after the purposes  
18 and amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

20 ARTICLE 10

21 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

1 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much  
 2 thereof as may be necessary are appropriated to the  
 3 Department of Agriculture for repairs, maintenance, and  
 4 capital improvements including construction, reconstruction,  
 5 improvement, repair and installation of capital facilities,  
 6 cost of planning, supplies, materials, equipment, services  
 7 and all other expenses required to complete the work:

8 Payable from Agricultural Premium Fund:

9	For various projects at the State	
10	Fairgrounds .....	600,000
11	For various projects at the DuQuoin State	
12	Fairgrounds .....	<u>250,000</u>
13	Total	\$850,000

14 Section 15. The amount of \$2,612,500, or so much thereof  
 15 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Partners for  
 16 Conservation Projects Fund to the Department of Agriculture  
 17 for the Conservation Practices Cost-Share program.

18 Section 20. The amount of \$2,612,500, or so much thereof  
 19 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital  
 20 Development Fund to the Department of Agriculture for deposit  
 21 into the Partners for Conservation Projects Fund.



1 95-734, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund  
2 to the Department of Central Management Services for  
3 Information Technology infrastructure expenses including but  
4 not limited to related hardware and equipment.

5 Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or  
6 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations  
7 in Section 5 of this Article until after the purposes and  
8 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

10 ARTICLE 23

11 CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT BOARD

12 Section 5. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof as  
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital  
14 Development Fund to the Capital Development Board for grants  
15 awarded under the Community Health Center Construction Act.

16 ARTICLE 25

17 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

18 Section 5. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as  
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Port Development

1 Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Commerce and  
2 Economic Opportunity for grants and loans associated with the  
3 Port Development Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30 ILCS  
4 750/9-11.

5 Section 20. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof  
6 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois  
7 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
8 Opportunity for a grant to Fermi National Accelerator  
9 Laboratory for the Illinois Accelerator Research Center.

10 Section 25. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof  
11 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois  
12 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
13 Opportunity for a grant to Argonne National Laboratory for  
14 the Advanced Protein Crystallization Facility.

15 Section 30. The sum of \$60,000,000, or so much thereof  
16 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois  
17 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
18 Opportunity for a grant to University of Illinois at  
19 Urbana/Champaign for all costs associated with design and  
20 construction of a Petascale Computing Facility.

21 Section 45. The amount of \$25,000,000 or so much thereof

1 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois  
2 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic  
3 Opportunity for grants associated with the redevelopment of  
4 brownfield sites.

5 Section 50. No contract shall be entered into or  
6 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any  
7 appropriation herein made in this Article until after the  
8 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the  
9 Governor.

10 Total, Article 25 \$118,000,000

11 ARTICLE 30

12 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

13 Section 5. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof as  
14 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
15 business on June 30, 2009, from a reappropriation heretofore  
16 made in Article 31, Section 10 of Public Act 95-734, is  
17 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the  
18 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants  
19 pursuant to 20 ILCS 605/605-332 - Coal Revival Program.

20 Section 10. The sum of \$1,975,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
2 business on June 30, 2009, from a reappropriation heretofore  
3 made in Article 31, Section 40 of Public Act 95-734, is  
4 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the  
5 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants  
6 associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels Development Act.

7 Section 15. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof  
8 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
9 business on June 30, 2009, from a reappropriation heretofore  
10 made in Article 31, Section 45 of Public Act 95-734, is  
11 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the  
12 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant  
13 to the Argonne National Laboratory for the Rare Isotope  
14 Accelerator for bondable infrastructure improvements. This  
15 appropriated amount shall be in addition to any other  
16 appropriated amounts which can be expended for these  
17 purposes.

18 Section 20. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof  
19 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
20 business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation heretofore  
21 made in Article 31, Section 75 of Public Act 95-734, is  
22 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the  
23 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the



1 specific purposes of acquisition, development, construction,  
2 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and  
3 technical planning and installation of capital facilities  
4 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and  
5 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources  
6 within the State.

7 Section 25. The amount of \$17,000,000, or so much  
8 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the  
9 close of business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation  
10 heretofore made in Article 31, Section 80 of Public Act 95-  
11 734, is reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the  
12 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the  
13 specific purposes of acquisition, development, construction,  
14 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and  
15 technical planning and installation of capital facilities  
16 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and  
17 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources  
18 within the State, including but not limited to a grant for a  
19 commercial scale project that produces electric power and  
20 hydrogen and demonstrates underground storage of up to 1  
21 million metric tons annually of carbon dioxide.

22 Section 30. The amount of \$7,000,000, or so much thereof  
23 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

1 business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation heretofore  
2 made in Article 31, Section 90 of Public Act 95-734, is  
3 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the  
4 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant  
5 to Argonne National Laboratory for the Advanced Protein  
6 Crystallization Facility.

7 Section 35. The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much  
8 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the  
9 close of business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation  
10 heretofore made in Article 31, Section 95 of Public Act 95-  
11 734, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to  
12 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a  
13 grant for the Illinois Science and Technology Park.

14 Section 40. The amount of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof  
15 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
16 business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation heretofore  
17 made in Article 31, Section 105 of Public Act 95-734, is  
18 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the  
19 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant  
20 to Fermi National Accelerator Laboratory for the Illinois  
21 Accelerator Research Center.

22 Section 45. The amount of \$20,000,000, or so much

1       thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the  
2       close of business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation  
3       heretofore made in Article 31, Section 120 of Public Act 95-  
4       734, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to  
5       the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for  
6       grants associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels  
7       Development Act.

8       Section 50.     The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much  
9       thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the  
10      close of business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation  
11      heretofore made in Article 31, Section 125 of Public Act 95-  
12      734, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to  
13      the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for  
14      grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

15      Section 55.     The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as  
16      may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
17      business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation heretofore  
18      made for such purpose in Article 1, Section 10 of Public Act  
19      95-1030, is reappropriated from the FY09 Budget Relief Fund  
20      to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for  
21      the Illinois Rural HealthNet.

22      Section 60.     The amount of \$35,000,000, or so much



1 units for the construction, maintenance, and improvement of  
2 boat access areas.

3 Section 15. The sum of \$120,000, or so much thereof as  
4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act  
5 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes  
6 of the Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act and for the  
7 administration and payment of grants to local governmental  
8 units for the construction, land acquisition, lease,  
9 maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and access

13 \$75,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is  
14 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the  
15 Department of Natural Resources for all costs for  
16 construction and development of facilities for transient,  
17 non-trailerable recreational boats, including grants for such  
18 purposes and authorized under the Boating Infrastructure  
19 Grant Program.

20 Section 25. The sum of \$150,000, new appropriation, is  
21 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the  
22 Department of Natural Resources for a grant to the Chain

1 O'Lakes - Fox River Waterway Management Agency for the  
2 Agency's operational expenses.

3 Section 30. The following named sums, new  
4 appropriations, or so much thereof as may be necessary,  
5 respectively, for the objects and purposes hereinafter named,  
6 are appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources:

7 Payable from State Boating Act Fund:

8 For multiple use facilities and  
9 programs for boating purposes  
10 provided by the Department of Natural  
11 Resources, including construction  
12 and development, all costs for supplies,  
13 materials, labor, land acquisition,  
14 services, studies and all other  
15 expenses required to comply with the  
16 intent of this appropriation .....1,500,000

17 Payable from State Parks Fund:

18 For multiple use facilities and programs  
19 for park and trail purposes provided by  
20 the Department of Natural Resources, including  
21 construction and development, all costs  
22 for supplies, materials, labor, land  
23 acquisition, services, studies, and  
24 all other expenses required to comply with

1 the intent of this appropriation .....150,000

2 Section 35. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as  
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish  
4 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for acquisition  
5 and development, including grants, for the implementation of  
6 the North American Waterfowl Management Plan within the  
7 Dominion of Canada or the United States which specifically  
8 provides waterfowl for the Mississippi Flyway.

9 Section 40. To the extent federal funds including  
10 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of  
11 \$100,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is  
12 appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the  
13 Department of Natural Resources for construction and  
14 renovation of waste reception facilities for recreational  
15 boaters, including grants for such purposes authorized under  
16 the Clean Vessel Act.

17 Section 50. The following named sums, or so much thereof  
18 as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either  
19 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government  
20 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or  
21 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or  
22 private corporation, organization, or individual, are

1 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for  
2 refunds and the purposes stated:

3 Payable from Forest Reserve Fund:

4 For U.S. Forest Service Program .....500,000

5 Section 55. The sum of \$110,000, or so much thereof as  
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Plugging and  
7 Restoration Fund to the Department of Natural Resources,  
8 Office of Mines and Minerals for the Landowner Grant Program  
9 authorized under the Oil and Gas Act, as amended by Public  
10 Act 90-0260.

11 Section 60. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as  
12 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of  
13 Natural Resources from the Abandoned Mined Lands Set Aside  
14 Fund for grants and contracts to conduct research, planning  
15 and construction to eliminate hazards created by abandoned  
16 mines and any other expenses necessary for emergency  
17 response.

18 Section 65. The sum of \$99,000, or so much thereof as  
19 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of  
20 Natural Resources from the State Furbearer Fund for the  
21 conservation of fur bearing mammals in accordance with the  
22 provisions of Section 5/1.32 of the "Wildlife Code", as now



1 or hereafter amended.

2 Section 70. The following named sums, new  
3 appropriations, or so much thereof as may be necessary,  
4 respectively, for the objects and purposes hereinafter named,  
5 are appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources:

6 Payable from Natural Areas Acquisition Fund:

7 For the acquisition, preservation and  
8 stewardship of natural areas, including habitats  
9 for endangered and threatened species, high  
10 quality natural communities, wetlands  
11 and other areas with unique or unusual  
12 natural heritage qualities .....3,000,000

13 Section 75. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof  
14 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Open Space  
15 Lands Acquisition and Development Fund to the Department of  
16 Natural Resources for expenses connected with and to make  
17 grants to local governments and to distressed communities as  
18 provided in the "Open Space Lands Acquisition and Development  
19 Act".

20 Section 80. The sum of \$495,000, or so much thereof as  
21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Pheasant  
22 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the

1 conservation of pheasants in accordance with the provisions  
2 of Section 5/1.31 of the "Wildlife Code", as now or hereafter  
3 amended.

4 FOR ILLINOIS HABITAT FUND PROGRAM

5 Section 85. The sum of \$1,215,000, or so much thereof as  
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat  
7 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the  
8 preservation and maintenance of high quality habitat lands in  
9 accordance with the provisions of the "Habitat Endowment  
10 Act", as now or hereafter amended.

11 Section 90. The sum of \$225,000, or so much thereof as  
12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat  
13 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the  
14 preservation and maintenance of a high quality fish and  
15 wildlife habitat and to promote the heritage of outdoor  
16 sports in Illinois from revenue derived from the sale of  
17 Sportsmen Series license plates.

18 Section 95. The sum of \$800,000, or so much thereof as  
19 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of  
20 Natural Resources for expenditure by the Office of Water  
21 Resources from the Flood Control Land Lease Fund for  
22 disbursement of monies received pursuant to Act of Congress

1 dated September 3, 1954 (68 Statutes 1266, same as appears in  
 2 Section 701c-3, Title 33, United States Code Annotated),  
 3 provided such disbursement shall be in compliance with 15  
 4 ILCS 515/1 Illinois Compiled Statutes.

5 Section 100. The following named sums, or so much  
 6 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either  
 7 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government  
 8 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or  
 9 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or  
 10 private corporation, organization, or individual, are  
 11 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for  
 12 refunds and the purposes stated:

13 Payable from Land and Water Recreation Fund:

14 For Outdoor Recreation Programs .....\$6,200,000

15 Section 105. The sum of \$600,000, or so much thereof as  
 16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Off Highway  
 17 Vehicle Trails Fund to the Department of Natural Resources  
 18 for grants to units of local governments, not-for-profit  
 19 organizations, and other groups to operate, maintain and  
 20 acquire land for off-highway vehicle trails and parks as  
 21 provided for in the Recreational Trails of Illinois Act,  
 22 including administration, enforcement, planning and  
 23 implementation of this Act.

1 Section 110. The following named sums, or so much  
 2 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either  
 3 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government  
 4 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or  
 5 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or  
 6 private corporation, organization, or individual, are  
 7 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for  
 8 refunds and the purposes stated:

9 Payable from Federal Title IV Fire

10 Protection Assistance Fund:

11 For Rural Community Fire Protection

12 Programs .....\$325,000

13 Section 115. The sum of \$80,000, or so much thereof as  
 14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Snowmobile Trail  
 15 Establishment Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for  
 16 the administration and payment of grants to nonprofit  
 17 snowmobile clubs and organizations for construction,  
 18 maintenance, and rehabilitation of snowmobile trails and  
 19 areas for the use of snowmobiles.

20 Section 120. The sum of \$625,000, or so much thereof as  
 21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Forestry  
 22 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for

1 the payment of grants to timber growers for implementation of  
2 acceptable forestry management practices as provided in the  
3 "Illinois Forestry Development Act" as now or hereafter  
4 amended.

5 Section 125. To the extent Federal Funds including  
6 reimbursements are made available for such purposes, the sum  
7 of \$300,000, is appropriated from the Illinois Forestry  
8 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for  
9 Forest Stewardship Technical Assistance.

10 Section 130. The sum of \$144,000, or so much thereof as  
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory  
12 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources  
13 for the payment of grants for the implementation of the North  
14 American Waterfowl Management Plan within the Dominion of  
15 Canada or the United States which specifically provides  
16 waterfowl to the Mississippi Flyway as provided in the  
17 "Wildlife Code", as amended.

18 Section 135. The sum of \$144,000, or so much thereof as  
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory  
20 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources  
21 for the payment of grants for the development of waterfowl  
22 propagation areas within the Dominion of Canada or the United

1 States which specifically provide waterfowl for the  
2 Mississippi Flyway as provided in the "Wildlife Code", as  
3 amended.

4 Section 140. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as  
5 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory  
6 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources  
7 for the purpose of attracting waterfowl and improving public  
8 migratory waterfowl areas within the State.

9 Section 145. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof  
10 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and  
11 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for  
12 grants to units of local government for the acquisition and  
13 development of bike paths.

14 Section 150. The sum of \$750,000, or so much thereof as  
15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and  
16 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for  
17 land acquisition, development and maintenance of bike paths  
18 and all other related expenses connected with the  
19 acquisition, development and maintenance of bike paths.

20 Section 155. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof  
21 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and

1 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for  
 2 the development and maintenance, and other related expenses  
 3 of recreational trails and trail-related projects authorized  
 4 under the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of  
 5 1991, provided such amount shall not exceed funds to be made  
 6 available for such purposes from state or federal sources.

7 Section 160. The following named sum, new appropriation,  
 8 or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the object and  
 9 purpose hereinafter named, is appropriated to the Department  
 10 of Natural Resources:

11 Payable from the Park and Conservation Fund:

12 For multiple use facilities and programs  
 13 for park and trail purposes provided by  
 14 the Department of Natural Resources, including  
 15 construction and development, all costs  
 16 for supplies, materials, labor, land  
 17 acquisition, services, studies, and  
 18 all other expenses required to comply with  
 19 the intent of this appropriation .....2,000,000

20 Section 165. The following named sums, new  
 21 appropriations, or so much thereof as may be necessary,  
 22 respectively, for the objects and purposes hereinafter named,  
 23 are appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources:

1 Payable from the Adeline Jay Geo-Karis  
 2 Illinois Beach Marina Fund:  
 3 For rehabilitation, reconstruction, repair,  
 4 replacing, fixed assets, and improvement  
 5 of facilities at North Point Marina at  
 6 Winthrop Harbor .....\$375,000

7 Section 170. The sum of \$6,000,000, or so much thereof  
 8 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of  
 9 Natural Resources from the Abandoned Mined Lands Reclamation  
 10 Council Federal Trust Fund for grants and contracts to  
 11 conduct research, planning and construction to eliminate  
 12 hazards created by abandoned mines, and any other expenses  
 13 necessary for emergency response.

14 Section 175. The sum of \$45,000,000, or so much thereof  
 15 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital  
 16 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for  
 17 the non-federal cost share of a Conservation Reserve  
 18 Enhancement Program to establish long-term contracts and  
 19 permanent conservation easements in the Illinois River Basin;  
 20 to fund cost-share assistance to landowners to encourage  
 21 approved conservation practices in environmentally sensitive  
 22 and highly erodible areas of the Illinois River Basin; and to  
 23 fund the monitoring of long-term improvements of these



1 conservation practices as required in the Memorandum of  
2 Agreement between the State of Illinois and the United States  
3 Department of Agriculture.

4 Section 180. The sum of \$42,015,000, or so much thereof as  
5 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital  
6 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for  
7 expenditure by the Office of Water Resources for water  
8 development projects at the approximate cost set forth below:

- 9 Addison Creek - Cook & Dupage
- 10 Counties - For construction
- 11 of the Addison Creek Flood
- 12 Control Project as developed
- 13 by the Addison Creek Restoration
- 14 Commission .....500,000
- 15 Ashland - Cass County - For
- 16 construction of a flood
- 17 control project to relieve flooding .....500,000
