1 AN ACT concerning finance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Environmental Protection Act is amended by changing Section 57.11 as follows:
- 6 (415 ILCS 5/57.11)
- 7 Sec. 57.11. Underground Storage Tank Fund; creation.
- 8 (a) There is hereby created in the State Treasury a special fund to be known as the Underground Storage Tank Fund. There shall be deposited into the Underground Storage Tank Fund all 10 monies received by the Office of the State Fire Marshal as fees 11 for underground storage tanks under Sections 4 and 5 of the 12 13 Gasoline Storage Act and as fees pursuant to the Motor Fuel Tax 14 Law. All amounts held in the Underground Storage Tank Fund shall be invested at interest by the State Treasurer. All 15 16 income earned from the investments shall be deposited into the 17 Tank Fund no less Underground Storage frequently than quarterly. Moneys in the Underground Storage Tank Fund, 18 19 pursuant to appropriation, may be used by the Agency and the 20 Office of the State Fire Marshal for the following purposes:
- 21 (1) To take action authorized under Section 57.12 to 22 recover costs under Section 57.12.
- 23 (2) To assist in the reduction and mitigation of damage

caused by leaks from underground storage tanks, including but not limited to, providing alternative water supplies to persons whose drinking water has become contaminated as a result of those leaks.

- (3) To be used as a matching amount towards federal assistance relative to the release of petroleum from underground storage tanks.
- (4) For the costs of administering activities of the Agency and the Office of the State Fire Marshal relative to the Underground Storage Tank Fund.
- (5) For payment of costs of corrective action incurred by and indemnification to operators of underground storage tanks as provided in this Title.
- (6) For a total of 2 demonstration projects in amounts in excess of a \$10,000 deductible charge designed to assess the viability of corrective action projects at sites which have experienced contamination from petroleum releases. shall Such demonstration projects be conducted accordance with the provision of this Title.
- (7) Subject to appropriation, moneys in the Underground Storage Tank Fund may also be used by the Department of Revenue for the costs of administering its activities relative to the Fund and for refunds provided for in Section 13a.8 of the Motor Fuel Tax Act.
- (b) Moneys in the Underground Storage Tank Fund may, pursuant to appropriation, be used by the Office of the State

- Fire Marshal or the Agency to take whatever emergency action is 1
- 2 necessary or appropriate to assure that the public health or
- 3 safety is not threatened whenever there is a release or
- substantial threat of a release of petroleum from 4
- 5 underground storage tank and for the costs of administering its
- 6 activities relative to the Underground Storage Tank Fund.
- 7 (c) Beginning July 1, 1993, the Governor shall certify to
- 8 the State Comptroller and State Treasurer the monthly amount
- 9 necessary to pay debt service on State obligations issued
- 10 pursuant to Section 6 of the General Obligation Bond Act. On
- 11 the last day of each month, the Comptroller shall order
- 12 transferred and the Treasurer shall transfer from the
- 13 Underground Storage Tank Fund to the General Obligation Bond
- Retirement and Interest Fund the amount certified by the 14
- 15 Governor, plus any cumulative deficiency in those transfers for
- 16 prior months.
- 17 (d) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this Section,
- the Underground Storage Tank Fund is not subject to 18
- 19 administrative charges authorized under Section 8h of the State
- Finance Act that would in any way transfer any funds from the 20
- 21 Underground Storage Tank Fund into any other fund of the State.
