SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/12-610.2 new

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that a person may not operate a motor vehicle on a roadway while using an electronic communication device to compose, send, or read an electronic message. Provides that a violation is an offense against traffic regulations governing the movement of vehicles. Sets forth exceptions.

- Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by adding
 Section 12-610.2 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/12-610.2 new)
- 7 Sec. 12-610.2. Electronic communication devices.
- 8 (a) As used in this Section:
- 9 <u>"Electronic communication device" means an electronic</u> 10 <u>device, including but not limited to a wireless telephone,</u> 11 <u>personal digital assistant, or a portable or mobile computer</u> 12 <u>while being used for the purpose of composing, reading, or</u> 13 <u>sending an electronic message, but does not include a global</u> 14 <u>positioning system or navigation system when the system is used</u> 15 <u>exclusively for navigation purposes.</u>
- 16 <u>"Electronic message" means a self-contained piece of</u> 17 <u>digital communication that is designed or intended to be</u> 18 <u>transmitted between physical devices. "Electronic message"</u> 19 <u>includes, but is not limited to electronic mail, a text</u> 20 <u>message, an instant message, or a command or request to access</u> 21 <u>an Internet site.</u>
- 22 (b) A person may not operate a motor vehicle on a roadway 23 while using an electronic communication device to compose,
