2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 1410 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4 5	"Section 5. The State Officials and Employees Ethics Act is amended by changing Section 1-5 as follows:
6	(5 ILCS 430/1-5)
7	Sec. 1-5. Definitions. As used in this Act:
8	"Appointee" means a person appointed to a position in or
9	with a State agency, regardless of whether the position is
10	compensated.
11	"Campaign for elective office" means any activity in
12	furtherance of an effort to influence the selection,
13	nomination, election, or appointment of any individual to any
14	federal, State, or local public office or office in a political
15	organization, or the selection, nomination, or election of
16	Presidential or Vice-Presidential electors, but does not

include activities (i) relating to the support or opposition of any executive, legislative, or administrative action (as those terms are defined in Section 2 of the Lobbyist Registration Act), (ii) relating to collective bargaining, or (iii) that are otherwise in furtherance of the person's official State duties.

6 "Candidate" means a person who has filed nominating papers 7 or petitions for nomination or election to an elected State 8 office, or who has been appointed to fill a vacancy in 9 nomination, and who remains eligible for placement on the 10 ballot at either a general primary election or general 11 election.

12 "Collective bargaining" has the same meaning as that term 13 is defined in Section 3 of the Illinois Public Labor Relations 14 Act.

15 "Commission" means an ethics commission created by this 16 Act.

17 "Compensated time" means any time worked by or credited to 18 a State employee that counts toward any minimum work time 19 requirement imposed as a condition of employment with a State 20 agency, but does not include any designated State holidays or 21 any period when the employee is on a leave of absence.

"Compensatory time off" means authorized time off earned by or awarded to a State employee to compensate in whole or in part for time worked in excess of the minimum work time required of that employee as a condition of employment with a State agency. "Contribution" has the same meaning as that term is defined
 in Section 9-1.4 of the Election Code.

3 "Employee" means (i) any person employed full-time, 4 part-time, or pursuant to a contract and whose employment 5 duties are subject to the direction and control of an employer 6 with regard to the material details of how the work is to be performed or (ii) any appointed or elected commissioner, 7 8 trustee, director, or board member of a board of a State 9 agency, including any retirement system or investment board 10 subject to the Illinois Pension Code or (iii) any other 11 appointee.

"Employment benefits" include but are not limited to the following: modified compensation or benefit terms; compensated time off; or change of title, job duties, or location of office or employment. An employment benefit may also include favorable treatment in determining whether to bring any disciplinary or similar action or favorable treatment during the course of any disciplinary or similar action or other performance review.

19 "Executive branch constitutional officer" means the 20 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of 21 State, Comptroller, and Treasurer.

22 "Gift" means any gratuity, discount, entertainment, 23 loan, forbearance, hospitality, or other tangible or 24 intangible item having monetary value including, but not 25 limited to, cash, food and drink, and honoraria for speaking government 26 engagements related to or attributable to

employment or the official position of an employee, member, or officer. <u>The value of a gift may be further defined by rules</u> <u>adopted by the appropriate ethics commission or by the Auditor</u> <u>General for the Auditor General and for employees of the office</u> <u>of the Auditor General.</u>

6 "Governmental entity" means a unit of local government 7 (including a community college district) or a school district 8 but not a State agency.

9 "Leave of absence" means any period during which a State 10 employee does not receive (i) compensation for State 11 employment, (ii) service credit towards State pension 12 benefits, and (iii) health insurance benefits paid for by the 13 State.

14 "Legislative branch constitutional officer" means a member 15 of the General Assembly and the Auditor General.

16 "Legislative leader" means the President and Minority 17 Leader of the Senate and the Speaker and Minority Leader of the 18 House of Representatives.

"Member" means a member of the General Assembly.

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20 "Officer" means an executive branch constitutional officer21 or a legislative branch constitutional officer.

"Political" means any activity in support of or in connection with any campaign for elective office or any political organization, but does not include activities (i) relating to the support or opposition of any executive, legislative, or administrative action (as those terms are 09600HB1410ham001 -5- LRB096 04896 JDS 43892 a

defined in Section 2 of the Lobbyist Registration Act), (ii) relating to collective bargaining, or (iii) that are otherwise in furtherance of the person's official State duties or governmental and public service functions.

5 "Political organization" means a party, committee, 6 association, fund, or other organization (whether or not 7 incorporated) that is required to file a statement of 8 organization with the State Board of Elections or a county 9 clerk under Section 9-3 of the Election Code, but only with 10 regard to those activities that require filing with the State 11 Board of Elections or a county clerk.

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"Prohibited political activity" means:

(1) Preparing for, organizing, or participating in any
 political meeting, political rally, political
 demonstration, or other political event.

16 (2) Soliciting contributions, including but not
17 limited to the purchase of, selling, distributing, or
18 receiving payment for tickets for any political
19 fundraiser, political meeting, or other political event.

20 (3) Soliciting, planning the solicitation of, or
21 preparing any document or report regarding any thing of
22 value intended as a campaign contribution.

(4) Planning, conducting, or participating in a public
 opinion poll in connection with a campaign for elective
 office or on behalf of a political organization for
 political purposes or for or against any referendum

1 question.

(5) Surveying or gathering information from potential
or actual voters in an election to determine probable vote
outcome in connection with a campaign for elective office
or on behalf of a political organization for political
purposes or for or against any referendum question.

7 (6) Assisting at the polls on election day on behalf of
8 any political organization or candidate for elective
9 office or for or against any referendum question.

10 (7) Soliciting votes on behalf of a candidate for 11 elective office or a political organization or for or 12 against any referendum question or helping in an effort to 13 get voters to the polls.

14 (8) Initiating for circulation, preparing,
15 circulating, reviewing, or filing any petition on behalf of
16 a candidate for elective office or for or against any
17 referendum question.

(9) Making contributions on behalf of any candidate for
elective office in that capacity or in connection with a
campaign for elective office.

(10) Preparing or reviewing responses to candidate questionnaires in connection with a campaign for elective office or on behalf of a political organization for political purposes.

(11) Distributing, preparing for distribution, or
 mailing campaign literature, campaign signs, or other

campaign material on behalf of any candidate for elective
 office or for or against any referendum question.

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(12) Campaigning for any elective office or for or against any referendum question.

5 (13) Managing or working on a campaign for elective
6 office or for or against any referendum question.

7 (14) Serving as a delegate, alternate, or proxy to a
8 political party convention.

9 (15) Participating in any recount or challenge to the 10 outcome of any election, except to the extent that under 11 subsection (d) of Section 6 of Article IV of the Illinois 12 Constitution each house of the General Assembly shall judge 13 the elections, returns, and qualifications of its members. 14 "Prohibited source" means any person or entity who:

(1) is seeking official action (i) by the member or officer or (ii) in the case of an employee, by the employee or by the member, officer, State agency, or other employee directing the employee;

19 (2) does business or seeks to do business (i) with the 20 member or officer or (ii) in the case of an employee, with 21 the employee or with the member, officer, State agency, or 22 other employee directing the employee;

(3) conducts activities regulated (i) by the member or
officer or (ii) in the case of an employee, by the employee
or by the member, officer, State agency, or other employee
directing the employee;

(4) has interests that may be substantially affected by
 the performance or non-performance of the official duties
 of the member, officer, or employee;

4 (5) is registered or required to be registered with the
5 Secretary of State under the Lobbyist Registration Act,
6 except that an entity not otherwise a prohibited source
7 does not become a prohibited source merely because a
8 registered lobbyist is one of its members or serves on its
9 board of directors; or

10 (6) is an agent of, a spouse of, or an immediate family 11 member who is living with a "prohibited source".

"State agency" includes all officers, boards, commissions 12 13 and agencies created by the Constitution, whether in the 14 executive or legislative branch; all officers, departments, 15 boards, commissions, agencies, institutions, authorities, 16 public institutions of higher learning as defined in Section 2 of the Higher Education Cooperation Act (except community 17 18 colleges), and bodies politic and corporate of the State; and administrative units or corporate outgrowths of the State 19 20 government which are created by or pursuant to statute, other 21 than units of local government (including community college districts) and their officers, school districts, and boards of 22 23 election commissioners; and all administrative units and 24 corporate outgrowths of the above and as may be created by 25 executive order of the Governor. President and Minority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker and Minority Leader of the House of Representatives, the Senate Operations Commission, and the legislative support services agencies. "State agency" includes the Office of the Auditor General. "State agency" does not include the judicial branch.

6 "State employee" means any employee of a State agency.
7 "Ultimate jurisdictional authority" means the following:

8 (1) For members, legislative partisan staff, and 9 legislative secretaries, the appropriate legislative 10 leader: President of the Senate, Minority Leader of the 11 Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives, or 12 Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.

13 (2) For State employees who are professional staff or
14 employees of the Senate and not covered under item (1), the
15 Senate Operations Commission.

16 (3) For State employees who are professional staff or
17 employees of the House of Representatives and not covered
18 under item (1), the Speaker of the House of
19 Representatives.

20 (4) For State employees who are employees of the
21 legislative support services agencies, the Joint Committee
22 on Legislative Support Services.

23 (5) For State employees of the Auditor General, the24 Auditor General.

25 (6) For State employees of public institutions of26 higher learning as defined in Section 2 of the Higher

Education Cooperation Act (except community colleges), the board of trustees of the appropriate public institution of higher learning.

4 (7) For State employees of an executive branch 5 constitutional officer other than those described in 6 paragraph (6), the appropriate executive branch 7 constitutional officer.

8 (8) For State employees not under the jurisdiction of
9 paragraph (1), (2), (3), (4), (5), (6), or (7), the
10 Governor.
