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1	AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 4318
2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 4318 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The Critical Health Problems and Comprehensive
5	Health Education Act is amended by changing Section 3 as
6	follows:
7	(105 ILCS 110/3) (from Ch. 122, par. 863)
8	Sec. 3. Comprehensive Health Education Program. The
9	program established under this Act shall include, but not be
10	limited to, the following major educational areas as a basis
11	for curricula in all elementary and secondary schools in this
12	State: human ecology and health, human growth and development,
13	the emotional, psychological, physiological, hygienic and
14	social responsibilities of family life, including sexual
15	abstinence until marriage, prevention and control of disease,
16	including instruction in grades 6 through 12 on the prevention,

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1 transmission and spread of AIDS, sexual assault awareness in secondary schools, public and environmental health, consumer 2 3 health, safety education and disaster survival, mental health 4 and illness, personal health habits, alcohol, drug use, and 5 abuse including the medical and legal ramifications of alcohol, 6 drug, and tobacco use, abuse during pregnancy, sexual abstinence until marriage, tobacco, nutrition, and dental 7 8 health. The program shall also provide course material and 9 instruction to advise pupils of the Abandoned Newborn Infant 10 Protection Act. The program shall include information about 11 cancer, including without limitation types of cancer, signs and symptoms, risk factors, the importance of early prevention and 12 13 detection, and information on where to go for help. 14 Notwithstanding the above educational areas, the following 15 areas may also be included as a basis for curricula in all 16 elementary and secondary schools in this State: basic first aid (including, but not limited to, cardiopulmonary resuscitation 17 18 and the Heimlich maneuver), early prevention and detection of 19 cancer, heart disease, diabetes, stroke, and the prevention of 20 child abuse, neglect, and suicide.

The school board of each public elementary and secondary school in the State shall encourage all teachers and other school personnel to acquire, develop, and maintain the knowledge and skills necessary to properly administer life-saving techniques, including without limitation the Heimlich maneuver and rescue breathing. 1 in accordance with standards of the American Red Cross, the American Heart Association, or another nationally recognized 2 3 certifying organization. A school board may use the services of 4 non-governmental entities whose personnel have expertise in 5 life-saving techniques to instruct teachers and other school personnel in these techniques. Each school board is encouraged 6 to have in its employ, or on its volunteer staff, at least one 7 person who is certified, by the American Red Cross or by 8 9 another qualified certifying agency, as qualified to 10 administer first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation. In 11 addition, each school board is authorized to allocate appropriate portions of its institute or inservice days to 12 13 conduct training programs for teachers and other school 14 personnel who have expressed an interest in becoming qualified 15 administer emergency first aid or cardiopulmonary to 16 resuscitation. School boards are urged to encourage their teachers and other school personnel who coach school athletic 17 programs and other extracurricular school activities to 18 19 acquire, develop, and maintain the knowledge and skills 20 necessary to properly administer first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation in accordance with standards and requirements 21 22 established by the American Red Cross or another qualified 23 certifying agency. Subject to appropriation, the State Board of 24 Education shall establish and administer a matching grant 25 program to pay for half of the cost that a school district 26 incurs in training those teachers and other school personnel

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1 who express an interest in becoming qualified to administer cardiopulmonary resuscitation (which training must be in 2 accordance with standards of the American Red Cross, the 3 4 American Heart Association, or another nationally recognized 5 certifying organization) or in learning how to use an automated 6 external defibrillator. A school district that applies for a grant must demonstrate that it has funds to pay half of the 7 8 cost of the training for which matching grant money is sought. 9 The State Board of Education shall award the grants on a 10 first-come, first-serve basis.

11 No pupil shall be required to take or participate in any 12 class or course on AIDS or family life instruction if his 13 parent or guardian submits written objection thereto, and 14 refusal to take or participate in the course or program shall 15 not be reason for suspension or expulsion of the pupil.

16 developed under Curricula programs established in accordance with this Act in the major educational area of 17 alcohol and drug use and abuse shall include classroom 18 instruction in grades 5 through 12. The instruction, which 19 20 shall include matters relating to both the physical and legal 21 effects and ramifications of drug and substance abuse, shall be 22 integrated into existing curricula; and the State Board of 23 Education shall develop and make available to all elementary 24 and secondary schools in this State instructional materials and 25 guidelines which will assist the schools in incorporating the 26 instruction into their existing curricula. In addition, school

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1	districts may offer, as part of existing curricula during the
2	school day or as part of an after school program, support
3	services and instruction for pupils or pupils whose parent,
4	parents, or guardians are chemically dependent.

7	Section 10. The Interscholastic Athletic Organization Act
8	is amended by adding Section 1.5 as follows:
9	(105 ILCS 25/1.5 new)
10	Sec. 1.5. Cancer screening. An association or other entity
11	that has as one of its purposes promoting, sponsoring,
12	regulating, or in any manner providing for interscholastic
13	athletics or any form of athletic competition among schools and
14	students within this State shall include a question asking
15	whether a student has a family history of cancer on any
16	pre-participation examination form given to students
17	participating or seeking to participate in interscholastic
18	athletics. The association or entity may require that a
19	testicular examination be conducted as a part of any physical
20	required for a male student's participation in interscholastic
21	athletics.".
