# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

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#### ARTICLE 5

ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

Section 5. The amount of \$3,883, or so much of this 6 7 amount as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30, 2009, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose 8 in Section 5 of Article 27 of Public Act 95-734, 9 is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the 10 Office of the Architect of the Capitol for 11 plans, specifications, and continuation of work pursuant to the 12 13 report and recommendations of the architectural, structural, and mechanical surveys of the State Capitol Building. This is 14 for the continuation of the rehabilitation of the Capitol 15 Building. 16

Section 10. The sum of \$553,641, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2009, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 27 of Public Act 95-734, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
