(b) At the time of the regular township election provided in the general election law, there shall be elected a township supervisor. The supervisor shall be ex-officio supervisor of general assistance. The supervisor shall hold office for a term of 4 years and until a successor is elected and qualified.

(d) At the time of the regular township election provided
in the general election law, there shall be elected by ballot
one township or multi-township assessor, as the case may be, in

shall hold office for a term of 4 years and until a successor
is elected and qualified.

12 (a) In all counties, the township collectors elected at the 13 township election shall enter upon their duties on January 1 14 next following their election and qualification <u>until after the</u> 15 <u>first election following the effective date of this amendatory</u> 16 <u>Act of the 96th General Assembly</u>.

In all counties, the term of the township collector elected 17 18 at the first election following the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 96th General Assembly shall begin on 19 20 January 1 next following his or her election and shall end on 21 the third Monday of May following the next election. 22 Thereafter, all township collectors shall serve a term of 4 years beginning on the third Monday of May following their 23 24 election.

(b) In all counties, township supervisors and township

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clerks shall enter upon their duties on the third Monday of May
 following their election.

3 (c) Beginning with elections in 1981 and through the
4 <u>election immediately preceding the effective date of this</u>
5 <u>amendatory Act of the 96th General Assembly</u> in all counties,
6 the township and multi-township assessors shall enter upon
7 their duties on January 1 next following their election.

In all counties, the term of the assessor or multi-township 8 9 assessor elected at the first election following the effective 10 date of this amendatory Act of the 96th General Assembly shall 11 begin on January 1 next following his or her election and shall 12 end on the third Monday of May following the next election. 13 Thereafter, all assessors or multi-township assessors shall 14 serve a term of 4 years beginning on the third Monday of May 15 following their election.
