1 AN ACT concerning criminal law.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Criminal Code of 1961 is amended by adding Section 19-2.5 as follows:
- 6 (720 ILCS 5/19-2.5 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 19-2.5. Unlawful sale of burglary tools.</u>
- 8 (a) For the purposes of this Section:
- 9 <u>"Lock bumping" means a lock picking technique for</u>
  10 <u>opening a pin tumbler lock using a specially-crafted</u>
  11 bumpkey.
- "Motor vehicle" has the meaning ascribed to it in the
  Illinois Vehicle Code.
- 14 <u>(b) A person commits the offense of unlawful sale of</u>
  15 <u>burglary tools when he or she knowingly sells or transfers any</u>
  16 <u>key, including a key designed for lock bumping, or a lock pick</u>
  17 <u>specifically manufactured or altered for use in breaking into a</u>
  18 <u>building, housetrailer, watercraft, aircraft, motor vehicle,</u>
  19 <u>railroad car, or any depository designed for the safekeeping of</u>
  20 property, or any part of that property.
- (c) This Section does not apply to the sale or transfer of
  any item described in subsection (b) to any peace officer or
  other employee of a law enforcement agency, or to any person or

- agency licensed as a locksmith under the Private Detective, 1
- 2 Private Alarm, Private Security, Fingerprint Vendor, and
- 3 Locksmith Act of 2004 or to any person engaged in the business
- of towing vehicles. 4
- (d) Sentence. Unlawful sale of burglary tools is a Class 4 5
- 6 felony.
