1 AN ACT concerning government.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Administrative Procedure Act is
amended by changing Section 5-30 as follows:

6 (5 ILCS 100/5-30) (from Ch. 127, par. 1005-30)

Sec. 5-30. Regulatory flexibility. When an agency proposes a new rule or an amendment to an existing rule that may have an impact on small businesses, not for profit corporations, or small municipalities, the agency shall do each of the following:

(a) The agency shall consider each of the following methods for reducing the impact of the rulemaking on small businesses, not for profit corporations, or small municipalities. The agency shall reduce the impact by utilizing one or more of the following methods if it finds that the methods are legal and feasible in meeting the statutory objectives that are the basis of the proposed rulemaking.

(1) Establish less stringent compliance or reporting
 requirements in the rule for small businesses, not for
 profit corporations, or small municipalities.

(2) Establish less stringent schedules or deadlines inthe rule for compliance or reporting requirements for small

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businesses, not for profit corporations, or small municipalities.

3 (3) Consolidate or simplify the rule's compliance or
 4 reporting requirements for small businesses, not for
 5 profit corporations, or small municipalities.

6 (4) Establish performance standards to replace design 7 or operational standards in the rule for small businesses, 8 not for profit corporations, or small municipalities.

9 (5) Exempt small businesses, not for profit 10 corporations, or small municipalities from any or all 11 requirements of the rule.

12 (b) Before or during the notice period required under 13 subsection (b) of Section 5-40, the agency shall provide an opportunity for small businesses, not for profit corporations, 14 15 or small municipalities to participate in the rulemaking 16 process. The agency shall utilize one or more of the following 17 These techniques are in addition to techniques. other rulemaking requirements imposed by this Act or by any other 18 19 Act.

(1) The inclusion in any advance notice of possible
rulemaking of a statement that the rule may have an impact
on small businesses, not for profit corporations, or small
municipalities.

(2) The publication of a notice of rulemaking in
 publications likely to be obtained by small businesses, not
 for profit corporations, or small municipalities.

(3)The direct notification of interested 1 small 2 businesses, not for profit corporations, or small 3 municipalities.

(4) The conduct of public hearings concerning the 4 5 impact of the rule on small businesses, not for profit corporations, or small municipalities. 6

7 (5) The use of special hearing or comment procedures to 8 reduce the cost or complexity of participation in the 9 rulemaking by small businesses, not for profit 10 corporations, or small municipalities.

11 (c) Prior to the filing of any proposed rule or amendment 12 that may have an adverse impact on small businesses, each 13 agency must prepare, or must request that the Business 14 Assistance Office of the Department of Commerce and Economic 15 Opportunity prepare and that Office must prepare, an economic 16 impact analysis that includes the following:

17 (1) an identification and estimate of the number of the small businesses subject to the proposed rule or amendment; 18 19 (2) the projected reporting, recordkeeping, and other 20 administrative costs required for compliance with the 21 proposed rule or amendment, including the type of 22 professional skills necessary for preparation of the 23 report or record;

alternative methods of achieving the purpose of the
 proposed rule or amendment.

Before the notice period required under subsection (b) of 3 Section 5-40, the Secretary of State shall provide to the 4 Business Assistance Office of the Department of Commerce and 5 6 Economic Opportunity a copy of any proposed rules or amendments 7 accepted for publication. The Business Assistance Office shall prepare an impact analysis of the rule describing the rule's 8 9 effect on small businesses whenever the Office believes, in its 10 discretion, that an analysis is warranted or whenever requested 11 to do so by 25 interested persons, an association representing 12 at least 100 interested persons, the Governor, a unit of local government, or the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules. The 13 impact analysis shall be completed before within the notice 14 period as described in subsection (b) of Section 5-40. Upon 15 16 completion of the analysis the agency Business Assistance 17 Office shall submit this analysis to the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, any interested person who requested the 18 analysis, and, if the agency prepared the analysis, to the 19 20 Business Assistance Office agency proposing the rule. The 21 impact analysis shall contain the following:

22 <u>This subsection does not apply to (i) rules promulgated in</u> 23 <u>accordance with the emergency rulemaking provisions of this</u> 24 <u>Article and (ii) rules and standards described in paragraphs</u> 25 <u>(1) through (5) of subsection (c) of Section 1-5.</u> 26 (1) A summary of the projected reporting,

1	recordkeeping, and other compliance requirements of the
2	proposed rule.
3	(2) A description of the types and an estimate of the
4	number of small businesses to which the proposed rule will
5	apply.
6	(3) An estimate of the economic impact that the
7	regulation will have on the various types of small
8	businesses affected by the rulemaking.
9	(4) A description or listing of alternatives to the
10	proposed rule that would minimize the economic impact of
11	the rule. The alternatives must be consistent with the
12	stated objectives of the applicable statutes and
13	regulations.
