1 AN ACT concerning safety.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Facilities Requiring Smoke Detectors Act is
amended by changing Section 2 as follows:

6 (425 ILCS 10/2) (from Ch. 127 1/2, par. 822)

Sec. 2. (a) Every facility shall be equipped with at least one approved smoke detector in an operating condition within 15 feet of every room used for sleeping purposes. The detector shall be installed on the ceiling and at least 6 inches from any wall, or on a wall located between 4 and 6 inches from the ceiling.

(b) Every facility shall have at least one approved smoke detector installed on every story of the facility, including basements but not including unoccupied attics; provided that there shall be at least one detector at the beginning and at the end of each separate corridor or hallway 200 feet or more in length in any occupied story, including basements.

(c) Every facility shall have at least one approved smoke detector at the uppermost ceiling of each interior stairwell, except in fire resistive structures. The detector shall be installed on the ceiling, at least 6 inches from the wall, or on a wall located between 4 and 6 inches from the ceiling. HB5821 Engrossed - 2 - LRB096 20660 DRJ 36377 b

1 (d) The requirements of this Section shall apply to any 2 facility in existence on July 1, 1988, beginning on that date. 3 Except as provided in subsection (e), the smoke detectors 4 required in such facilities may be either battery powered or 5 wired into the structure's AC power line, and need not be 6 interconnected.

7 In the case of any facility unit that is newly (e) 8 constructed, reconstructed or substantially remodelled after 9 December 31, 1987, the requirements of this Section shall apply 10 beginning on the first day of occupancy of the facility after 11 such construction, reconstruction or substantial remodelling. 12 The smoke detectors required in such facility shall be permanently wired into the structure's AC power line and, if 13 14 more than one detector is required to be installed within the 15 facility, the detectors shall be wired so that the actuation of 16 one detector will actuate all the detectors in the facility 17 unit.

In the case of any facility unit that is newly constructed, reconstructed, or substantially remodeled on or after January 1, 2011, smoke detectors permanently wired into the structure's AC power line must also maintain an alternative back-up power source, which may be either a battery or batteries or an emergency generator.

(f) Compliance with an applicable federal, State or local
law, rule or building code which requires the installation and
maintenance of smoke detectors in a manner different from this

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1 Section, but providing a level of safety for occupants which is 2 equal to or greater than that provided by this Section, shall 3 be deemed to be compliance with this Section, and the 4 requirements of such more stringent law shall govern over the 5 requirements of this Section.

6 (g) In the case of a facility subject to this Act, the 7 provisions of this Act shall be enforced by the State agency 8 which licenses that facility. The State licensing agency may 9 suspend the facility's license for a violation of this Act 10 where appropriate.

Section 10. The Smoke Detector Act is amended by changing Section 3 as follows:

14 (425 ILCS 60/3) (from Ch. 127 1/2, par. 803)

Sec. 3. (a) Every dwelling unit shall be equipped with at least one approved smoke detector in an operating condition within 15 feet of every room used for sleeping purposes. The detector shall be installed on the ceiling and at least 6 inches from any wall, or on a wall located between 4 and 6 inches from the ceiling.

(b) Every single family residence shall have at least one approved smoke detector installed on every story of the dwelling unit, including basements but not including unoccupied attics. In dwelling units with split levels, a smoke HB5821 Engrossed - 4 - LRB096 20660 DRJ 36377 b

detector installed on the upper level shall suffice for the adjacent lower level if the lower level is less than one full story below the upper level; however, if there is an intervening door between the adjacent levels, a smoke detector shall be installed on each level.

6 (c) Every structure which (1) contains more than one 7 dwelling unit, or (2) contains at least one dwelling unit and 8 is a mixed-use structure, shall contain at least one approved 9 smoke detector at the uppermost ceiling of each interior 10 stairwell. The detector shall be installed on the ceiling, at 11 least 6 inches from the wall, or on a wall located between 4 12 and 6 inches from the ceiling.

13 (d) It shall be the responsibility of the owner of a 14 structure to supply and install all required detectors. The 15 owner shall be responsible for making reasonable efforts to 16 test and maintain detectors in common stairwells and hallways. 17 It shall be the responsibility of a tenant to test and to provide general maintenance for the detectors within the 18 19 tenant's dwelling unit or rooming unit, and to notify the owner 20 or the authorized agent of the owner in writing of any deficiencies which the tenant cannot correct. The owner shall 21 22 be responsible for providing one tenant per dwelling unit with 23 written information regarding detector testing and 24 maintenance.

The tenant shall be responsible for replacement of any required batteries in the smoke detectors in the tenant's HB5821 Engrossed - 5 - LRB096 20660 DRJ 36377 b

dwelling unit, except that the owner shall ensure that such batteries are in operating condition at the time the tenant takes possession of the dwelling unit. The tenant shall provide the owner or the authorized agent of the owner with access to the dwelling unit to correct any deficiencies in the smoke detector which have been reported in writing to the owner or the authorized agent of the owner.

8 (e) The requirements of this Section shall apply to any 9 dwelling unit in existence on July 1, 1988, beginning on that 10 date. Except as provided in subsections (f) and (g), the smoke 11 detectors required in such dwelling units may be either battery 12 powered or wired into the structure's AC power line, and need 13 not be interconnected.

(f) In the case of any dwelling unit that is newly 14 15 constructed, reconstructed, or substantially remodelled after 16 December 31, 1987, the requirements of this Section shall apply 17 beginning on the first day of occupancy of the dwelling unit construction. reconstruction 18 after such or substantial 19 remodelling. The smoke detectors required in such dwelling unit 20 shall be permanently wired into the structure's AC power line, and if more than one detector is required to be installed 21 22 within the dwelling unit, the detectors shall be wired so that 23 the actuation of one detector will actuate all the detectors in 24 the dwelling unit.

In the case of any dwelling unit that is newly constructed,
 reconstructed, or substantially remodeled on or after January

5 (g) Every hotel shall be equipped with operational portable 6 smoke-detecting alarm devices for the deaf and hearing impaired 7 of audible and visual design, available for units of occupancy.

Specialized smoke-detectors for the deaf and hearing 8 9 impaired shall be available upon request by quests in such 10 hotels at a rate of at least one such smoke detector per 75 11 occupancy units or portions thereof, not to exceed 5 such smoke 12 detectors per hotel. Incorporation or connection into an 13 existing interior alarm system, so as to be capable of being activated by the system, may be utilized in lieu of the 14 15 portable alarms.

Operators of any hotel shall post conspicuously at the main desk a permanent notice, in letters at least 3 inches in height, stating that smoke detector alarm devices for the deaf and hearing impaired are available. The proprietor may require a refundable deposit for a portable smoke detector not to exceed the cost of the detector.

(h) Compliance with an applicable federal, State or local law or building code which requires the installation and maintenance of smoke detectors in a manner different from this Section, but providing a level of safety for occupants which is equal to or greater than that provided by this Section, shall HB5821 Engrossed -7- LRB096 20660 DRJ 36377 b be deemed to be in compliance with this Section, and the requirements of such more stringent law shall govern over the requirements of this Section.
