SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/21-9

from Ch. 122, par. 21-9

Amends the School Code. Provides that, in order to substitute teach in the public schools, a person holding a valid substitute teacher's certificate or a person holding a valid early childhood certificate, a valid elementary certificate, a valid high school certificate, or a valid special certificate shall register as a substitute teacher with the regional superintendent of schools in each educational service region where the person will be employed. Provides that a person who registers as a substitute teacher with the regional superintendent of schools is responsible for the payment of fees to register the certificate for its period of validity, authorization of a criminal history records check and checks of the Statewide Sex Offender Database and Statewide Child Murderer and Violent Offender Against Youth Database, payment of the cost of the criminal history records check and checks of the Statewide Sex Offender Database and Statewide Child Murderer and Violent Offender Against Youth Database, and providing evidence of physical fitness and freedom from communicable disease, including tuberculosis. Requires the regional superintendent of schools to maintain a file for each registered substitute teacher in the educational service region that includes that information and to issue a signed and sealed certificate of authorization to the substitute teacher. Provides that the certificate shall be presented to all prospective employing school districts in the educational service region, who shall photocopy the certificate and keep a copy of the certificate with employment records for the substitute teacher. Requires the State Board of Education to maintain a centralized electronic database of substitute teacher registrations that includes data from each educational service region.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
21-9 as follows:

7 Sec. 21-9. Substitute certificates and substitute8 teaching.

9 (a) A substitute teacher's certificate may be issued for teaching in all grades of the common schools. Such certificate 10 may be issued upon request of the regional superintendent of 11 schools of any region in which the teacher is to teach. A 12 substitute teacher's certificate is valid for teaching in the 13 14 public schools of any county. Such certificate may be issued to persons who either (a) hold a certificate valid for teaching in 15 16 the common schools as shown on the face of the certificate, (b) 17 hold a bachelor of arts degree from an institution of higher learning accredited by the North Central Association or other 18 comparable regional accrediting association or have been 19 20 graduated from a recognized institution of higher learning with 21 a bachelor's degree, or (c) have had 2 years of teaching 22 experience and meet such other rules and regulations as may be adopted by the State Board of Education in consultation with 23

the State Teacher Certification Board. Such certificate shall
 expire on June 30 in the fourth year from date of issue.
 Substitute teacher's certificates are not subject to
 endorsement as described in Section 21-1b of this Code.

5 (b) A teacher holding a substitute teacher's certificate may teach only in the place of a certified teacher who is under 6 7 contract with the employing board and may teach only when no 8 appropriate fully certified teacher is available to teach in a 9 substitute capacity. A teacher holding an early childhood 10 certificate, an elementary certificate, а hiqh school 11 certificate, or a special certificate may also substitute teach 12 in grades K-12 but only in the place of a certified teacher who is under contract with the employing board. A substitute 13 14 teacher may teach only for a period not to exceed 90 paid 15 school days or 450 paid school hours in any one school district 16 in any one school term. However, a teacher holding an early 17 childhood, elementary, high school, or special certificate may substitute teach for a period not to exceed 120 paid school 18 19 days or 600 paid school hours in any one school district in any 20 one school term. Where such teaching is partly on a daily and partly on an hourly basis, a school day shall be considered as 21 22 5 hours. The teaching limitations imposed by this subsection 23 upon teachers holding substitute certificates shall not apply 24 in any school district operating under Article 34.

photocopy the certificate for its files and verify the 1 2 substitute teacher's registration status using a centralized 3 electronic database of substitute teacher registrations. 4 The State Board of Education shall maintain a centralized 5 electronic database of substitute teacher registrations that includes data from each educational service region. 6 The 7 regional superintendent of schools shall verify to the State 8 Board of Education that a criminal history records check and 9 checks of the Statewide Sex Offender Database and Statewide 10 Child Murderer and Violent Offender Against Youth Database has 11 been conducted and is on file in the main office of the 12 regional superintendent of schools. The centralized electronic 13 database of substitute teacher registrations shall be accessible via the Internet by regional superintendents of 14 schools and their designees and must be used to verify that a 15 16 criminal history records check and checks of the Statewide Sex 17 Offender Database and Statewide Child Murderer and Violent Offender Against Youth Database have been conducted and are on 18 19 file for any substitute teacher wishing to register in multiple 20 educational service regions so that the cost of a criminal 21 history records check and checks of the Statewide Sex Offender 22 Database and Statewide Child Murderer and Violent Offender 23 Against Youth Database is incurred only once by a substitute 24 teacher over the validity period of the certificate. 25 The State Board of Education and the regional 26 superintendents of schools shall collaborate in establishing
