#### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends Public Act 96-46 to remove an appropriation of \$2,700,000 from the State Board of Education Federal Department of Education Fund to the State Board of Education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2009, to be used by the State Board exclusively for the Longitudinal Data Systems Project and not, under any circumstances, for personal services expenditures or other operational or administrative costs. Appropriates \$2,700,000 from the Federal Department of Education Fund to the State Board of Education for the payment of ordinary and contingent expenses related to the Longitudinal Data System. Effective immediately.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**  
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. "An Act making appropriations", Public Act 96-  
5 46, approved July 15, 2009, is amended by changing Section 7  
6 of Article 60 and adding Section 8 to Article 60 as follows:

7 (P.A. 96-46, Article 60, Section 7)

8 Sec. 7. The following amounts, or so much thereof as may  
9 be necessary, which shall be used by the Illinois State Board  
10 of Education exclusively for the foregoing purposes and not,  
11 under any circumstances, for personal services expenditures  
12 or other operational or administrative costs, are  
13 appropriated to the Illinois State Board of Education for the  
14 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2009:
