1 AN ACT making appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

6 Section 5. The amount of \$3,883, or so much of this
7 amount as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30,
8 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose
9 in Section 5 of Article 5 of Public Act 96-0035, is
10 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
11 Office of the Architect of the Capitol for plans,
12 specifications, and continuation of work pursuant to the
13 report and recommendations of the architectural, structural,
14 and mechanical surveys of the State Capitol Building. This
15 is for the continuation of the rehabilitation of the Capitol
16 Building.

17 Section 10. The sum of \$548,180, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
19 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
20 made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 5 of Public

1 Act 96-0035, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
2 Fund to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol for
3 remodeling, planning, relocation, permanent equipment, and
4 other related expenses, including architectural and
5 engineering fees associated with construction, for the
6 remodeling of office space and other support areas under the
7 jurisdiction of the House of Representatives and the Senate.

8 Section 15. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof
9 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
10 business on June 30, 2010, from an appropriation heretofore
11 made for such purpose in Article 3, Section 50 of Public Act
12 96-0039, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
13 Development Fund to the Office of the Architect of the
14 Capitol for all costs associated with capital upgrades and
15 improvements.

16 Section 20. No contract shall be entered into or
17 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations
18 in Sections 5, 10 and 15 of this Article until after the
19 purposes and amounts have been approved in writing by the
20 Governor.

Section 5. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof as
 4 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
 5 business on June 30, 2010, from an appropriation heretofore
 6 made for such purpose in Article 140, Section 5 of Public Act
 7 96-0035, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
 8 to the Secretary of State for capital grants to public
 9 libraries for permanent improvements.

Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or
 11 obligation incurred or any expenditures made from
 12 appropriations in this Article until after the purposes and
 13 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much
 18 thereof as may be necessary are appropriated to the
 19 Department of Agriculture for repairs, maintenance, and
 20 capital improvements including construction, reconstruction,

1 improvement, repair and installation of capital facilities,
 2 cost of planning, supplies, materials, equipment, services
 3 and all other expenses required to complete the work:

4 Payable from Agricultural Premium Fund:

5 For various projects at the State

6 Fairgrounds 600,000

7 For various projects at the DuQuoin State

8 Fairgrounds 250,000

9 Total \$850,000

10 Section 15. The amount of \$8,000,000, or so much thereof
 11 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Partners for
 12 Conservation Projects Fund to the Department of Agriculture
 13 for the Conservation Practices Cost-Share program.

14 Section 20. The amount of \$8,000,000, or so much thereof
 15 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
 16 Development Fund to the Department of Agriculture for deposit
 17 into the Partners for Conservation Projects Fund.

18 Section 25. No contract shall be entered into or
 19 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations
 20 in Section 20 of this Article until after the purposes and
 21 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

3 DEPARTMENT OF CENTRAL MANAGEMENT SERVICES

4 Section 5. The sum of \$20,000,000, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary is appropriated from the Capital Development
6 Fund to the Department of Central Management Services for the
7 Department of Corrections for OTS conversion.

8 Section 10. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof
9 as may be necessary is appropriated from the Capital
10 Development Fund to the Department of Central Management
11 Services for capital costs relating to a pilot program to
12 develop centralized citizen servicing centers; including, but
13 not limited to renovation of facilities.

14 Section 15. The sum of \$19,000,000, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
16 Development Fund to the Department of Central Management
17 Services for the Illinois Century Network.

18 Section 20. No contract shall be entered into or
19 obligation incurred or any expenditures made from
20 appropriations in this Article until after the purposes and

1 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

2 Total, this Article \$49,000,000

3 ARTICLE 20

4 DEPARTMENT OF CENTRAL MANAGEMENT SERVICES

5 Section 5. The sum of \$8,062,735, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2010, from an appropriation heretofore
8 made for such purpose in Article 20, Section 5 of Public Act
9 96-0035, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
10 to the Department of Central Management Services for
11 Information Technology infrastructure expenses including but
12 not limited to related hardware and equipment.

13 Section 10. The amount of \$13,500,000, or so much
14 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
15 close of business on June 30, 2010, from an appropriation
16 heretofore made for such purposes in Section 5 of Article 15
17 of Public Act 96-0035, is reappropriated from the Capital
18 Development Fund to the Department of Central Management
19 Services for infrastructure improvement, hardware and related
20 costs.

1 Section 15. The sum of \$26,000,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2010, from an appropriation heretofore
4 made for such purpose in Article 5, Section 35 of Public Act
5 96-0039, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
6 Development Fund to the Department of Central Management
7 Services for the Illinois Century Network.

8 Section 20. No contract shall be entered into or
9 obligation incurred or any expenditures made from
10 appropriations in this Article until after the purposes and
11 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

14 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

15 Section 10. The sum of \$6,300,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
17 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
18 Opportunity for a grant for infrastructure to match Federal
19 funds.

20 Section 15. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof

1 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
2 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
3 Opportunity to develop a grant program for new and existing
4 commercial fisheries and processing facilities to reduce or
5 eliminate Asian Carp populations in Illinois.

6 Section 20. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
8 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
9 Opportunity for the University of Illinois Dixon Springs
10 Agriculture Center for the design and construction of a new
11 Center of Agriculture and Food Sciences and the renovation of
12 existing facilities to accommodate emerging agricultural
13 technologies.

14 Section 25. The sum of \$20,000,000, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
16 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
17 Opportunity for renewable energy projects; including but not
18 limited to, hydroelectric and ethanol-based energy
19 generation.

20 Section 30. The sum of \$30,000,000, or so much thereof
21 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
22 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

1 Opportunity for green business and manufacturing development.

2 Section 35. The sum of \$40,000,000, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
4 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
5 Opportunity for Illinois-based smart grid deployment and
6 related projects and technologies.

7 Section 40. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
9 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
10 Opportunity for the University of Chicago Medical Center for
11 costs related to the Center for Community Health and for a
12 community-based facility for job training and education.

13 Section 45. The sum of \$1,800,000, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
15 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
16 Opportunity for the YMCA of Metropolitan Chicago for Camp
17 Duncan for capital costs for Camp Independence.

18 Section 50. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
20 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
21 Opportunity for a grant to the H-Group for construction of a

1 laundry facility and related equipment for job creation for
2 the developmentally disabled to match federal funds.

3 Section 55. No contract shall be entered into or
4 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
5 appropriation herein made in this Article until after the
6 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
7 Governor.

8 Total, this Article \$120,100,000

9 ARTICLE 30

10 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

11 Section 1. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
13 business on June 30, 2010, from an appropriation heretofore
14 made for such purposes in Section 5 of Article 25 of Public
15 Act 96-0035, from the Port Development Revolving Loan Fund to
16 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
17 grants and loans associated with the Port Development
18 Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30 ILCS 750/9-11.

19 Section 5. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

1 business on June 30, 2010, from an appropriation heretofore
2 made for such purposes in Section 20 of Article 25 of Public
3 Act 96-0035, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
4 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
5 for a grant to Fermi National Accelerator Laboratory for the
6 Illinois Accelerator Research Center.

7 Section 10. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
9 business on June 30, 2010, from an appropriation heretofore
10 made for such purposes in Section 25 of Article 25 of Public
11 Act 96-0035, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
12 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
13 for a grant to Argonne National Laboratory for the Advanced
14 Protein Crystallization Facility.

15 Section 15. The sum of \$60,000,000, or so much thereof
16 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
17 business on June 30, 2010, from an appropriation heretofore
18 made for such purposes in Section 30 of Article 25 of Public
19 Act 96-0035, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
20 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
21 for a grant to University of Illinois at Urbana/Champaign for
22 all costs associated with design and construction of a
23 Petascale Computing Facility.

1 Section 20. The amount of \$25,000,000 or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2010, from an appropriation heretofore
4 made for such purposes in Section 45 of Article 25 of Public
5 Act 96-0035, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
6 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
7 for grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield
8 sites.

9 Section 25. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof
10 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
11 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
12 made in Article 30, Section 5 of Public Act 96-0035, is
13 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
14 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
15 pursuant to 20 ILCS 605/605-332 - Coal Revival Program.

16 Section 30. The sum of \$1,975,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
18 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
19 made in Article 30, Section 10 of Public Act 96-0035, is
20 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
21 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
22 associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels Development Act.

1 Section 35. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
4 made in Article 30, Section 15 of Public Act 96-0035, as
5 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
6 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
7 grant to Argonne National Laboratory for bondable
8 infrastructure improvements to match federal and private
9 funds of equal or greater value.

10 Section 40. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof
11 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
12 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
13 made in Article 30, Section 20 of Public Act 96-0035, is
14 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
15 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
16 specific purposes of acquisition, development, construction,
17 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and
18 technical planning and installation of capital facilities
19 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
20 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources
21 within the State.

22 Section 45. The amount of \$17,000,000, or so much

1 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
2 close of business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation
3 heretofore made in Article 30, Section 25 of Public Act 96-
4 0035, is reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
5 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
6 specific purposes of acquisition, development, construction,
7 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and
8 technical planning and installation of capital facilities
9 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
10 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources
11 within the State, including but not limited to a grant for a
12 commercial scale project that produces electric power and
13 hydrogen and demonstrates underground storage of up to 1
14 million metric tons annually of carbon dioxide.

15 Section 50. The amount of \$7,000,000, or so much thereof
16 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
17 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
18 made in Article 30, Section 30 of Public Act 96-0035, is
19 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
20 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
21 to Argonne National Laboratory for the Advanced Protein
22 Crystallization Facility.

23 Section 55. The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much

1 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
2 close of business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation
3 heretofore made in Article 30, Section 35 of Public Act 96-
4 0035, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
5 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
6 grant for the Illinois Science and Technology Park.

7 Section 60. The amount of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
9 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
10 made in Article 30, Section 40 of Public Act 96-0035, is
11 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
12 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
13 to Fermi National Accelerator Laboratory for the Illinois
14 Accelerator Research Center.

15 Section 65. The amount of \$20,000,000, or so much
16 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
17 close of business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation
18 heretofore made in Article 30, Section 45 of Public Act 96-
19 0035, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
20 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
21 grants associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels
22 Development Act.

1 Section 70. The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much
2 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
3 close of business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation
4 heretofore made in Article 30, Section 50 of Public Act 96-
5 0035, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
6 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
7 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

8 Section 75. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much
9 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
10 close of business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation
11 heretofore made in Article 30, Section 60 of Public Act 96-
12 0035, is reappropriated from the Coal Development Bond Fund
13 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
14 the purpose of facility cost reports prepared pursuant to
15 Section 1-75(d)(4) of the Illinois Power Agency Act.

16 Section 80. The sum of \$4,580,704, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
18 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
19 made in Article 125, Section 10 of Public Act 96-0035, as
20 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
21 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
22 grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8,
23 Article 9 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

1 Section 85. The sum of \$3,130,040, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
4 made for such purpose in Article 125, Section 15 of Public
5 Act 96-0035, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
6 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
7 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
8 Article 8 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

9 Section 90. The sum of \$2,600,251, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
11 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
12 made for such purpose in Article 125, Section 20 of Public
13 Act 96-0035, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
14 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
15 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
16 Article 8, Article 9 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

17 Section 95. The sum of \$5,567,122, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
19 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
20 made for such purpose in Article 125, Section 25 of Public
21 Act 96-0035, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
22 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

1 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
2 Article 8, Article 9 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

3 Section 100. The sum of \$4,524,172, or so much thereof
4 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
5 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
6 made for such purpose in Article 125, Section 30 of Public
7 Act 96-0035, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
8 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
9 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
10 Article 8, Article 9 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

11 Section 105. The sum of \$208,871,848, or so much thereof
12 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
13 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
14 made for such purpose in Article 125, Section 40 of Public
15 Act 96-0035, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
16 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
17 Opportunity for the purpose of making grants and loans to
18 local governments for planning, engineering, acquisition,
19 construction, reconstruction, development, improvement and
20 extension of the public infrastructure, and for any other
21 purposes authorized in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the
22 Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for
23 such purposes.

1 Section 110. The sum of \$47,500,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
4 made for such purpose in Article 125, Section 45 of Public
5 Act 96-0035, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
6 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
7 Opportunity for the purpose of fostering economic development
8 and increased employment and the well being of the citizens
9 of Illinois, and for any other purposes authorized in
10 subsection (b) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
11 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

12 Section 115. The sum of \$30,639,116, or so much thereof
13 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
14 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
15 made for such purpose in Article 125, Section 50 of Public
16 Act 96-0035, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
17 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
18 Opportunity for the development and improvement of
19 educational, scientific, technical and vocational programs
20 and facilities and the expansion of health and human
21 services, and for any other purposes authorized in subsection
22 (c) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for
23 grants to State agencies for such purposes.

1 Section 120. The sum of \$30,000,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
4 made for such purpose in Article 125, Section 55 of Public
5 Act 96-0035, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
6 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
7 Opportunity for open spaces, recreational and conservation
8 purposes and the protection of land and for deposits into the
9 Conservation 2000 Projects Fund as authorized by subsection
10 (c) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for
11 grants to State agencies for such purposes.

12 Section 125. The sum of \$35,455,843, or so much thereof
13 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
14 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
15 made for such purpose in Article 125, Section 60 of Public
16 Act 96-0035, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
17 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
18 Opportunity for grants to local governments for the
19 acquisition, financing, architectural planning, development,
20 alteration, installation, and construction of capital
21 facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable
22 equipment, and land as authorized by subsection (1) of
23 Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to

1 State agencies for such purposes.

2 Section 130. The amount of \$10,000,000, or so much
3 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
4 close of business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation
5 heretofore made for such purpose in Article 125, Section 65
6 of Public Act 96-0035, is reappropriated from the Capital
7 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
8 Opportunity for grants to local governments for the
9 acquisition, financing, architectural planning, development,
10 alteration, installation, and construction of capital
11 facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable
12 equipment, and land as authorized by subsection (1) of
13 Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to
14 State agencies for such purposes.

15 Section 135. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much
16 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
17 close of business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation

19 of Public Act 96-0035, as amended, is reappropriated from the
20 Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
21 Economic Opportunity for grants pursuant but not limited to
22 Article 8, Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois
23 Act.

1 Section 140. The sum of \$13,745,450, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore
4 made for such purpose in Article 125, Section 75 of Public
5 Act 96-0035, as amended, is reappropriated from the Fund for
6 Illinois' Future to the Department of Commerce and Economic
7 Opportunity for grants to units of government, educational
8 facilities and not-for-profit organizations for education and
9 training, infrastructure improvements and other capital
10 projects including but not limited to planning, construction,
11 reconstruction, equipment, utilities and vehicles, and all
12 costs associated with economic development programs,
13 community service programs, public health programs, public
14 safety programs, other programs and activities, and for
15 grants to other State agencies for any capital or operating
16 purposes.

17 Section 145. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much
18 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
19 close of business on June 30, 2010, from an appropriation
