Bill and assigned to major in Business Administration; Mary was born in Cairo, to Joe and Elois Flamm, the second of two daughters; she went to St. Patrick's Catholic School and then Cairo Public High School; she was active in school plays in high school and was the student radio reporter for the school; her senior year she was chosen by the Daughter's Of the American Revolution for The Good Citizenship Award; Mary was also a member of the Girl Scouts throughout the 10th grade; she worked at a local movie theater and then later a ladies ready-to-wear store; after graduating high school she went to Carbondale to Southern Illinois University; Paul and Mary met while Mary was in Lawrenceville visiting a former neighbor who was the librarian at Paul's high school; they then met again at a Catholic Youth

1 Group and the Newman Club at college; they were married 2 November 26, 1949, and had seven children; they moved to Mt.
