14 was later employed by the Veterans Administration and the
15 Illinois Department of Transportation until his retirement in
16 2000; and

18 Conception Roman Catholic Church, the Knights of Columbus, the
19 American Legion, the VFW, the Mattoon Letterman's Club, and the
20 Mattoon High School Hall of Fame; he served on the Coles County
21 Board, the Embarras River Basin Agency, and the Coles County

3 WHEREAS, Jack Record was preceded in death by his parents,
4 his 2 sisters, and his 3 brothers; and

5 WHEREAS, Jack Record is survived by his wife; his children,
6 Sally Eck and her husband, Todd, and their children, Amanda and
7 Dustin (Lindsey); Susan and her friend, Paul Comforti; Sheila;
8 Shady Raboin and her husband, Jeff, and their son, Jack; and
9 Rush and his wife, Stephanie, and their children, Kennedy and
10 Delaney; he is also survived by his 3 step-grandchildren and
