SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

40 ILCS 5/16-143.3 new 40 ILCS 5/17-121.1 new

Amends the Downstate Teacher and the Chicago Teacher Articles of the Illinois Pension Code. Allows a designated domestic partner to qualify as a surviving spouse for purposes of survivor and death benefits. Effective immediately.

1 AN ACT concerning public employee benefits.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Pension Code is amended by adding Sections 16-143.3 and 17-121.1 as follows:
- 6 (40 ILCS 5/16-143.3 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 16-143.3. Domestic partner eligibility.</u>
- (a) Beginning July 1, 2009, an unmarried teacher may 8 9 designate a domestic partner by filing a written designation 10 with the System in the manner prescribed by the System. The System may require reasonable evidence that the person 11 12 designated meets the qualifications set forth in subsection (c). Such a designation is revocable at any time, but may not 13 14 be made or changed more than once in any 24-month period. The marriage of a teacher automatically revokes any designation of 15 16 a domestic partner previously made by that teacher.
 - (b) The designated domestic partner of a teacher shall be eligible to receive survivor and death benefits under this Article in the same manner and subject to the same conditions as a surviving spouse. For the purposes of determining eligibility for those benefits, the date of designation of a domestic partner shall be deemed the equivalent of the date of marriage, and the revocation or change of a designation shall

- Sec. 17-121.1. Domestic partner eligibility.
- 17 (a) Beginning July 1, 2009, an unmarried teacher may
- 18 designate a domestic partner by filing a written designation
- 19 with the Fund in the manner prescribed by the Fund. The Fund
- 20 may require reasonable evidence that the person designated
- 21 meets the qualifications set forth in subsection (c). Such a
- designation is revocable at any time, but may not be made or
- changed more than once in any 24-month period. The marriage of
- 24 a teacher automatically revokes any designation of a domestic
- 25 partner previously made by that teacher.

(b) The designated domestic partner of a teacher shall be eligible to receive survivor and death benefits under this Article in the same manner and subject to the same conditions as a surviving spouse. For the purposes of determining eligibility for those benefits, the date of designation of a domestic partner shall be deemed the equivalent of the date of marriage, and the revocation or change of a designation shall be deemed the equivalent of termination of the marriage. References in this Article and other applicable Articles of this Code to a surviving spouse shall be deemed to include a surviving designated domestic partner.

(c) "Domestic partner" means an individual of the same gender as an unmarried teacher who (1) is involved with the teacher in a long-term relationship of indefinite duration; (2) has resided together with the teacher at the same address for at least 12 months; (3) is not related to the teacher by blood to a degree of closeness that would prohibit legal marriage in the state in which they legally reside; (4) is not married to any other person; and (5) has an exclusive mutual commitment to the teacher in which they agree to be jointly responsible for each other's common welfare and to share financial obligations.

22 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 23 becoming law.
