1 AN ACT concerning finance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The General Obligation Bond Act is amended by changing Section 5 as follows:
- 6 (30 ILCS 330/5) (from Ch. 127, par. 655)
- 7 Sec. 5. School Construction.
- (a) The $\frac{\text{The}}{\text{The}}$ amount of \$58,450,000 is authorized to make 8 9 grants to local school districts for the acquisition, development, construction, reconstruction, 10 rehabilitation, 11 improvement, financing, architectural planning installation of capital facilities, including but not limited 12 13 to those required for special education building projects 14 provided for in Article 14 of The School Code, consisting of buildings, structures, and durable equipment, and for the 15 16 acquisition and improvement of real property and interests in 17 real property required, or expected to be required, in connection therewith. 18
 - (b) \$22,550,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for grants to school districts for the making of principal and interest payments, required to be made, on bonds issued by such school districts after January 1, 1969, pursuant to any indenture, ordinance, resolution, agreement or contract to

- provide funds for the acquisition, development, construction, 1 2 reconstruction, rehabilitation, improvement, architectural planning and installation of capital facilities consisting of 3 buildings, structures, durable equipment and land 4 5 educational purposes or for lease payments required to be made by a school district for principal and interest payments on 6 7 bonds issued by a Public Building Commission after January 1, 1969. 8
- 9 (c) \$10,000,000 for grants to school districts for the
 10 acquisition, development, construction, reconstruction,
 11 rehabilitation, improvement, architectural planning and
 12 installation of capital facilities consisting of buildings
 13 structures, durable equipment and land for special education
 14 building projects.
 - (d) \$9,000,000 for grants to school districts for the reconstruction, rehabilitation, improvement, financing and architectural planning of capital facilities, including construction at another location to replace such capital facilities, consisting of those public school buildings and temporary school facilities which, prior to January 1, 1984, were condemned by the regional superintendent under Section 3-14.22 of The School Code or by any State official having jurisdiction over building safety.
 - (e) \$3,050,000,000 for grants to school districts for school improvement projects authorized by the School Construction Law. The bonds shall be sold in amounts not to

1	exceed the following schedule, except any bonds not sold during
2	one year shall be added to the bonds to be sold during the
3	remainder of the schedule:
4	First year \$200,000,000
5	Second year \$450,000,000
6	Third year \$500,000,000
7	Fourth year \$500,000,000
8	Fifth year \$800,000,000
9	Sixth year and thereafter \$600,000,000
