

96TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2009 and 2010 SB1404

Introduced 2/11/2009, by Sen. Kwame Raoul

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 1305/1-35 new

Amends the Department of Human Services Act. Provides that the Department shall cooperate with the Department of Corrections, community-based organizations, and social service providers to make information available to children of incarcerated parents. Provides that the Department of Human Services must make information for families and children of incarcerated parents available on its website and through its existing toll-free telephone numbers. Provides that the Department of Corrections shall provide inmates with a sealed envelope containing information about programs for families and children of incarcerated parents so that the inmate may send the materials to the guardian of his or her children. Provides that postage shall be paid by the inmate, but the Department of Corrections shall pay the postage if the inmate is indigent. Effective immediately.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Department of Human Services Act is amended by adding Section 1-35 as follows:

- Sec. 1-35. Families of incarcerated parents. The

 Department of Human Services and the Illinois Department of

 Corrections shall work cooperatively with community

 organizations and service providers to identify local

 providers of services and to develop informational materials
- for families and children of incarcerated parents.
- Department of Human Services shall 13 The develop 14 informational materials for families and children of incarcerated parents. The materials shall be designed to inform 15 16 children and families of incarcerated parents about the social 17 services that are available to them, including visitation programs, family counseling, mentoring, school-based programs, 18 19 and other programs identified by community organizations that work with families of prisoners. The materials shall be 20 21 designed to reduce stigma and to provide support for children 22 of incarcerated parents. The materials shall (i) provide telephone and Internet contacts for the children's caregivers 2.3

- 1 with further information and (ii) assist the children's
- 2 caregivers in locating and accessing services for the children.
- 3 The Department shall make this information available through
- 4 its website and through its existing toll-free telephone
- 5 numbers.
- 6 The Department of Corrections shall provide the materials
- 7 to inmates during orientation. The Department of Corrections
- 8 shall provide one sealed envelope containing the public
- 9 information to the inmate so that the inmate may address it to
- 10 the inmate's children's caregiver. The Department of
- 11 Corrections shall mail that envelope to the address provided by
- the inmate. The cost of postage will be charged to the inmate's
- 13 trust account. If the inmate is indigent, the Department of
- 14 Corrections shall pay the postage fees for mailing the
- informational material to the inmate's children's caregiver.
- The informational materials shall also be made available within
- 17 <u>the Department of Corrections' facility visiting rooms and</u>
- 18 waiting areas.
- 19 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 20 becoming law.
