2 Sec. 25. Enrollment in Program. The Department shall develop procedures to allow application agents to assist in 3 4 enrolling children in the Program or other children's health 5 programs operated by the Department. At the Department's 6 discretion, technical assistance payments may be 7 available for approved applications facilitated by 8 application agent. The Department shall permit day and 9 temporary labor service agencies, as defined in the Day and Temporary Labor Services Act and doing business in Illinois, to 10 11 enroll as unpaid application agents. As established in the Free Healthcare Benefits Application Assistance Act, it shall be 12 13 unlawful for any person to charge another person or family for assisting in completing and submitting an application for 14 15 enrollment in this Program.
