30 ILCS 605/7.6

Amends the State Property Control Act. Provides that the administrator and the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority must (rather than have the authority to) transfer certain assets and personnel to the Illinois Public Safety Agency Network. Imposes conditions on rulemaking. Effective immediately.

AN ACT concerning State property.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The State Property Control Act is amended by 5 changing Section 7.6 as follows:

6 (30 ILCS 605/7.6)

7 7.6. Illinois Public Safety Sec. Agency Network. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act or any other 8 9 law to the contrary, the administrator and the Illinois 10 Criminal Justice Information Authority must are authorized under this Section to transfer to the Illinois Public Safety 11 Agency Network, from the Illinois Criminal Justice Information 12 13 Authority, all contractual personnel, books, records, papers, 14 documents, property, both real and personal, and pending business in any way pertaining to the operations of the ALERTS, 15 16 ALECS, and PIMS systems managed by the Authority including, but 17 limited to, radio frequencies, licenses, software, not hardware, IP addresses, proprietary information, code, and 18 19 other required information and elements necessary for the 20 successful operation, future development, and transition of 21 the systems.
