## 1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 2060 AMENDMENT NO. \_\_\_\_\_. Amend Senate Bill 2060 by replacing 2 3 everything after the enacting clause with the following: "Section 5. The Pharmacy Practice Act is amended by 4 changing Section 26 as follows: 5 6 (225 ILCS 85/26) 7 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2018) Sec. 26. Anti-epileptic drug product selection prohibited. 8 (a) The General Assembly finds that this Section is 9 10 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety. 11 12 (b) In this Section: 13 "Anti-epileptic drug" means (i) any drug prescribed for the treatment of epilepsy or (ii) a drug used to treat or prevent 14

"Epilepsy" means a neurological condition characterized by

- 1 recurrent seizures.
- 2 "Seizure" means a brief disturbance in the electrical activity of the brain. 3
- 4 (c) When the prescribing physician has indicated on the 5 original prescription "may not substitute", a pharmacist may 6 not interchange an anti-epileptic drug or formulation of an 7 anti-epileptic drug for the treatment of epilepsy without notification and the documented consent of the prescribing 8 9 physician and the patient or the patient's parent, legal 10 quardian, or spouse. This Section does not apply to medication 11 orders issued for anti-epileptic drugs for any in-patient care in a licensed hospital. 12
- 13 (d) If a pharmacist substitutes any prescription for an 14 anti-epileptic drug with a drug other than the specific drug 15 originally prescribed or dispensed, then the pharmacist shall 16 provide written notice to the patient.
