- 9 (a) In keeping with the goals outlined in the federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, the State of 10 Illinois hereby creates the Innovation, Intervention, and 11 12 Restructuring Task Force to develop recommendations for the innovation, intervention, and restructuring of schools, 13 14 including those that need comprehensive or focused intervention, as those terms are defined by this State's 15 proposal for participation in the No Child Left Behind 16 17 differentiated accountability pilot project. (b) The task force shall consist of the following members: 18
- 20 <u>(2) Two additional members, each appointed by the</u> 21 Governor.

(1) One chairperson, appointed by the Governor.

1	(6) The amount of funding necessary to accomplish any
2	and all strategies included in the task force's
3	recommendation.
4	(7) The identification of any statutory or regulatory
5	changes that would be necessary or helpful to promote
6	successful innovation, intervention, and restructuring.
7	(d) In developing its recommendations, the task force shall
8	compile relevant data. Moreover, the task force shall seek
9	input from statewide school community organizations, including
10	organizations representing teachers, administrators, and
11	parents, as well as civic, business, and child advocacy
12	organizations and any other source deemed appropriate.
13	The State Board of Education shall provide administrative
14	support to the task force.
15	(e) The task force shall submit a comprehensive report to
16	the Governor, the General Assembly, and the State
17	Superintendent of Education not later than December 31, 2009.
18	The task force may, with the written approval of the Governor,
19	reconvene for the purposes of continued study and the
20	development of additional recommendations.
