#### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Makes appropriations for the ordinary and contingent expenses of the Illinois Commerce Commission for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2009, as follows:

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**  
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much  
6 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, are appropriated  
7 for the ordinary and contingent expenses to the Illinois  
8 Commerce Commission:

10 Section 15. The sum of \$150,000, or so much thereof as  
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Underground  
12 Utility Facilities Damage Prevention Fund to the Illinois  
13 Commerce Commission for a grant to the Statewide One-call  
14 Notice System, as required in the Illinois Underground  
15 Utility Facilities Damage Prevention Act.

16 Section 20. The sum of \$1,000, or so much thereof as may  
17 be necessary, is appropriated from the Underground Utility  
18 Facilities Damage Prevention Fund to the Illinois Commerce  
19 Commission for refunds.

20 Section 25. The sum of \$83,600,000, or so much thereof  
21 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wireless  
22 Service Emergency Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission

1 for its administrative costs and for grants to emergency  
2 telephone system boards, qualified government entities, or  
3 the Department of State Police for the design,  
4 implementation, operation, maintenance, or upgrade of  
5 wireless 9-1-1 or E9-1-1 emergency services and public safety  
6 answering points.

7 Section 30. The sum of \$8,252,600, or so much thereof as  
8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wireless Carrier  
9 Reimbursement Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission for  
10 reimbursement of wireless carriers for costs incurred in  
11 complying with the applicable provisions of Federal  
12 Communications Commission wireless enhanced 9-1-1 services  
13 mandates and for administrative costs incurred by the  
14 Illinois Commerce Commission related to administering the  
15 program.

16 Section 40. The amount of \$727,100, or so much thereof as  
17 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
18 business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation heretofore  
19 made for such purpose in Article 2, Section 40 of Public Act  
20 95-732, is reappropriated from the Digital Divide Elimination  
21 Infrastructure Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission for  
22 grants and awards for the construction of high-speed data  
23 transmission facilities.

1 Section 45. The following named amounts, or so much  
 2 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, are appropriated  
 3 from the Transportation Regulatory Fund for ordinary and  
 4 contingent expenses to the Illinois Commerce Commission:

21 Section 50. The sum of \$4,450,700, or so much thereof as  
 22 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Transportation  
 23 Regulatory Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission for (1)

1     disbursing funds collected for the Single State Insurance  
2     Registration Program and/or Unified Carrier Registration  
3     System; (2) for refunds for overpayments; and (3) for  
4     administrative expenses.

5             Section 55. The sum of \$520,000, or so much thereof as  
6     may be necessary, is appropriated from the Transportation  
7     Regulatory Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission for  
8     railroad crossing improvement initiatives.

9             Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,  
10     2009.
