

## 96TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2009 and 2010 SB3524

Introduced 2/10/2010, by Sen. Martin A. Sandoval

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 2705/2705-317

Amends the Department of Transportation Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois. Deletes the word "construction" throughout and renames the "Safe Routes to School Construction Program" as the "Safe Routes to School Program" in a provision concerning State use of federal Safe Routes to Schools Program funds. Provides that federal Safe Routes to School funds shall be competitively awarded to project proposals including planning, design, construction, training, education, and program coordination, with a minimum of 10% and a maximum of 30% allocated to non-infrastructure projects. Provides that the amounts of grants of all federal Safe Routes to Schools Program funds shall be apportioned to projects located in the following areas: (1) within a municipality with a population over 500,000; (2) within municipalities with a population between 40,000 and 500,000; and (3) all other municipalities and unincorporated areas. Effective immediately.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Department of Transportation Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is amended by changing Section 2705-317 as follows:
- 7 (20 ILCS 2705/2705-317)
- 8 Sec. 2705-317. Safe Routes to School Construction Program.
- 9 (a) Upon enactment of a federal transportation bill with a dedicated fund available to states for safe routes to schools, 10 the Department, in cooperation with the State Board of 11 Education and the Department of State Police, shall establish 12 and administer a Safe Routes to School Construction Program for 13 14 the construction of bicycle and pedestrian safety and traffic-calming projects, including infrastructure 15 and 16 non-infrastructure related projects, using the federal Safe 17 Routes to Schools Program funds. Subject to subsection (b-5) of this Section and any applicable federal requirements, federal 18 Safe Routes to School funds shall be competitively awarded to 19 20 project proposals including planning, design, construction, 21 training, education, and program coordination, with a minimum 22 of 10% and a maximum of 30% allocated to non-infrastructure projects. 23

- (b) <u>Subject to subsection (b-5) of this Section</u>, the <u>The Department shall make construction</u> grants available to local governmental agencies under the Safe Routes to School <u>Construction</u> Program based on the results of a statewide competition that requires submission of Safe Routes to School proposals for funding and that rates those proposals on all of the following factors:
  - (1) Demonstrated needs of the grant applicant.
  - (2) Potential of the proposal for reducing child injuries and fatalities.
  - (3) Potential of the proposal for encouraging increased walking and bicycling among students.
    - (4) Identification of safety hazards.
  - (5) Identification of current and potential walking and bicycling routes to school.
    - (6) Consultation and support for projects by school-based associations, local traffic engineers, local elected officials, law enforcement agencies, and school officials.
- 20 (7) Proximity to parks and other recreational facilities.

With respect to the use of federal Safe Routes to Schools

Program funds, prior to the award of a construction grant or
the use of those funds for a Safe Routes to School project
encompassing a highway, the Department shall consult with and
obtain approval from the Department of State Police and the

- 1 highway authority with jurisdiction to ensure that the Safe
- 2 Routes to School proposal is consistent with a statewide
- 3 pedestrian safety statistical analysis.
- 4 (b-5) The amounts of grants of all federal Safe Routes to
- 5 Schools Program funds shall be apportioned to projects located
- 6 <u>in the following areas: (1) within a municipality with a</u>
- 7 population over 500,000; (2) within municipalities with a
- 8 population between 40,000 and 500,000; and (3) all other
- 9 municipalities and unincorporated areas.
- 10 (c) On March 30 of each year, 2006 and each March 30th
- 11 thereafter, the Department shall submit a report to the General
- 12 Assembly listing and describing the projects funded under the
- 13 Safe Routes to School Construction Program.
- 14 (d) The Department shall study the effectiveness of the
- 15 Safe Routes to School Construction Program, with particular
- 16 emphasis on the Program's effectiveness in reducing traffic
- accidents and its contribution to improving safety and reducing
- 18 the rate number of child injuries and fatalities in the
- 19 vicinity of a Safe Routes to School project. The Department
- 20 shall submit a report to the General Assembly on or before
- 21 December 31, 2006 regarding the results of the study.
- 22 (e) The Department, the State Board of Education, and the
- 23 Department of State Police may adopt any rules necessary to
- 24 implement this Section.

- Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon

becoming law. 1
