A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much of
5 those amounts as may be necessary, respectively, for the
6 objects and purposes named, are appropriated from the General
7 Revenue Fund to meet the ordinary and contingent expenses of
8 the Office of the State Appellate Defender:

1 Section 10. The following named amounts, or so much of
 2 those amounts as may be necessary, respectively, are
 3 appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Office of
 4 the State Appellate Defender for the ordinary and contingent
 5 expenses of the Capital Post-Conviction Unit:

18 Section 15. The following named amounts, or so much of
 19 those amounts as may be necessary, respectively, for the
 20 objects and purposes named, are appropriated to the Office
 21 of the State Appellate Defender for expenses related to
 22 federally assisted programs to work on systemic sentencing
 23 issues appeals cases to which the agency is appointed:

24 Payable from State Appellate Defender

1 Federal Trust Fund\$210,000
 2 Matching Funds payable from General Revenue Fund65,000

3 Section 20. The sum of \$4,434,385, or so much thereof as
 4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Litigation
 5 Trust Fund to the Office of the State Appellate Defender, to
 6 be divided for expenses incurred in providing assistance to
 7 trial attorneys (\$3,230,213) and for expenses incurred in
 8 providing assistance in Capital Post-Conviction Cases
 9 (\$1,204,172).

10 Section 25. The sum of \$315,000, or so much thereof as may
 11 be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
 12 to the Office of the State Appellate Defender for the
 13 ordinary and contingent expenses of the Expungement Program.

14 Section 30. The sum of \$50,000, or so much thereof as may
 15 be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
 16 to the Office of the State Appellate Defender to provide
 17 statewide training to Public Defenders under the Public
 18 Defender Training Program.

19 Section 35. The sum of \$350,000, or so much thereof as may
 20 be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
 21 to the Office of the State Appellate Defender to develop a

1 Juvenile Defender Resource Center.

2 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
3 2010.
