No alcoholic liquors shall be sold or delivered 8 in any building belonging to or under the control of the State 9 or any political subdivision thereof except as provided in this The corporate authorities of any city, village, 10 Act. incorporated town or township, or county may provide by 11 ordinance, however, that alcoholic liquor may be sold or 12 13 delivered in any specifically designated building belonging to 14 or under the control of the municipality, or township, or county, or in any building located on land under the control of 15 16 the municipality, township, or county; provided that such 17 township or county complies with all applicable local ordinances in any incorporated area of the township or county. 18 19 Alcoholic liquor may be delivered to and sold under the 20 authority of a special use permit on any property owned by a conservation district organized under the Conservation 21 22 District Act, provided that (i) the alcoholic liquor is sold only at an event authorized by the governing board of the 23

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and 6 sold at any airport belonging to or under the control of a 7 municipality of more than 25,000 inhabitants, or in any 8 building or on any golf course owned by a park district 9 organized under the Park District Code, subject to the approval 10 of the governing board of the district, or in any building or 11 on any golf course owned by a forest preserve district 12 organized under the Downstate Forest Preserve District Act, subject to the approval of the governing board of the district, 13 or on the grounds within 500 feet of any building owned by a 14 15 forest preserve district organized under the Downstate Forest 16 Preserve District Act during times when food is dispensed for 17 consumption within 500 feet of the building from which the food is dispensed, subject to the approval of the governing board of 18 19 the district, or in a building owned by a Local Mass Transit 20 District organized under the Local Mass Transit District Act, 21 subject to the approval of the governing Board of the District, 22 or in Bicentennial Park, or on the premises of the City of 23 Mendota Lake Park located adjacent to Route 51 in Mendota, 24 Illinois, or on the premises of Camden Park in Milan, Illinois, 25 or in the community center owned by the City of Loves Park that 26 is located at 1000 River Park Drive in Loves Park, Illinois,

or, in connection with the operation of an established food 1 2 serving facility during times when food is dispensed for consumption on the premises, and at the following aquarium and 3 museums located in public parks: Art Institute of Chicago, 4 5 Chicago Academy of Sciences, Chicago Historical Society, Field 6 Museum of Natural History, Museum of Science and Industry, 7 DuSable Museum of African American History, John G. provided that with respect to a facility for conference and 1 convention type activities alcoholic liquors shall be limited 2 to the use of the convention or conference participants or 3 participants in cultural, political or educational activities 4 5 held in such facilities, and provided further that the faculty 6 or staff of the State university or a public community college 7 district, or members of an organization of students, alumni, 8 faculty or staff of the State university or a public community 9 college district are active participants in the conference or 10 convention, or in Memorial Stadium on the campus of the 11 University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign during games in 12 which the Chicago Bears professional football team is playing in that stadium during the renovation of Soldier Field, not 13 more than one and a half hours before the start of the game and 14 15 not after the end of the third quarter of the game, or in the 16 Pavilion Facility on the campus of the University of Illinois 17 at Chicago during games in which the Chicago Storm professional soccer team is playing in that facility, not more than one and 18 19 a half hours before the start of the game and not after the end 20 of the third quarter of the game, or in the Pavilion Facility on the campus of the University of Illinois at Chicago during 21 22 games in which the WNBA professional women's basketball team is 23 playing in that facility, not more than one and a half hours 24 before the start of the game and not after the 10-minute mark 25 of the second half of the game, or by a catering establishment which has rented facilities from a board of trustees of a 26

public community college district, or in a restaurant that is 1 2 operated by a commercial tenant in the North Campus Parking Deck building that (1) is located at 1201 West University 3 Avenue, Urbana, Illinois and (2) is owned by the Board of 4 5 Trustees of the University of Illinois, or, if approved by the 6 District board, on land owned by the Metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater Chicago and leased to others for a term of 7 8 at least 20 years. Nothing in this Section precludes the sale 9 or delivery of alcoholic liquor in the form of original 10 packaged goods in premises located at 500 S. Racine in Chicago 11 belonging to the University of Illinois and used primarily as a 12 grocery store by a commercial tenant during the term of a lease 13 that predates the University's acquisition of the premises; but 14 the University shall have no power or authority to renew, 15 transfer, or extend the lease with terms allowing the sale of alcoholic liquor; and the sale of alcoholic liquor shall be 16 17 subject to all local laws and regulations. In addition, any policy submitted by the Board of 17 Trustees to the Illinois Liquor Control Commission must require that any event at which alcoholic liquors are served or sold in 18 buildings under the control of the Board of Trustees shall 19 20 require the prior written approval of the Office of the Chancellor for the University campus where the event is 21 22 located. The Board of Trustees shall submit its policy, and any 23 subsequently revised, updated, new, or amended policies, to the Illinois Liquor Control Commission, and any University event, 24 25 or location for an event, exempted under such policies shall 26 apply for a license under the applicable Sections of this Act.

Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit organization or agency of the State from employing the services of a catering establishment for the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors at functions authorized by the Department of Central Management Services.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in a building that is owned by McLean County, situated on land owned by the county in the City of Bloomington, and used by the McLean County Historical Society if the sale or delivery is approved by an ordinance adopted by the county board, and the municipality in which the building is located may not prohibit that sale or delivery, notwithstanding any other provision of HB1491 Engrossed - 21 - LRB097 05146 ASK 45191 b

this Section. The regulation of the sale and delivery of 1 2 alcoholic liquor in a building that is owned by McLean County, 3 situated on land owned by the county, and used by the McLean County Historical Society as provided in this paragraph is an 4 5 exclusive power and function of the State and is a denial and 6 limitation under Article VII, Section 6, subsection (h) of the 7 Illinois Constitution of the power of a home rule municipality 8 to regulate that sale and delivery.

9 Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in any building 10 situated on land held in trust for any school district 11 organized under Article 34 of the School Code, if the building 12 is not used for school purposes and if the sale or delivery is 13 approved by the board of education.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in buildings owned by the Community Building Complex Committee of Boone County, Illinois if the person or facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquor has provided dram shop liability insurance with coverage and in amounts that the Committee reasonably determines are necessary.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in the building located at 1200 Centerville Avenue in Belleville, Illinois and occupied by either the Belleville Area Special Education District or the Belleville Area Special Services Cooperative.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at the Louis Joliet Renaissance Center, City Center Campus, located at 214 N. Ottawa Street, Joliet, and the Food Services/Culinary Arts HB1491 Engrossed - 22 - LRB097 05146 ASK 45191 b

Department facilities, Main Campus, located at 1215 Houbolt
 Road, Joliet, owned by or under the control of Joliet Junior
 College, Illinois Community College District No. 525.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at Triton
College, Illinois Community College District No. 504.

6 Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at the 7 building located at 446 East Hickory Avenue in Apple River, 8 Illinois, owned by the Apple River Fire Protection District, 9 and occupied by the Apple River Community Association if the 10 alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only in connection with 11 organized functions approved by the Apple River Community 12 Association for which the planned attendance is 20 or more persons and if the person or facility selling or dispensing the 13 14 alcoholic liquor has provided dram shop liability insurance in 15 maximum limits so as to hold harmless the Apple River Fire 16 Protection District, the Village of Apple River, and the Apple 17 River Community Association from all financial loss, damage, and harm. 18

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at the Sikia Restaurant, Kennedy King College Campus, located at 740 West 63rd Street, Chicago, and at the Food Services in the Great Hall/Washburne Culinary Institute Department facility, Kennedy King College Campus, located at 740 West 63rd Street, Chicago, owned by or under the control of City Colleges of Chicago, Illinois Community College District No. 508.
