## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- or her acts or omissions in providing resuscitation, be liable
- 18 for civil damages, unless the acts or omissions constitute
- 19 willful and wanton misconduct.

- exemption from civil liability for emergency care. As provided 1 2 in Section 30 of the Automated External Defibrillator Act, any 3 automated external defibrillator user who has successfully 4 completed training in accordance with the standards of the 5 American Red Cross or the American Heart Association and who in 6 good faith and without fee or compensation renders emergency 7 medical care involving the use of an automated external defibrillator in accordance with his or her training is not 8 9 liable for any civil damages as a result of any act or 10 omission, except for willful and wanton misconduct, by that 11 person in rendering that care.
- Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 13 14 becoming law.
