Amends the Illinois Police Training Act. Provides that the Executive Director of the Illinois Board of Higher Education shall no longer serve on the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning local government.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Illinois Police Training Act is amended by
5 changing Section 3 as follows:

6 (50 ILCS 705/3) (from Ch. 85, par. 503)

7 Sec. 3. Board - composition - appointments - tenure -
8 vacancies. The Board shall be composed of 18 ~~19~~ members
9 selected as follows: The Attorney General of the State of
10 Illinois, the Director of State Police, the Director of
11 Corrections, the Superintendent of the Chicago Police
12 Department, the Sheriff of Cook County, the Director of the
13 Illinois Police Training Institute, the Special Agent in Charge
14 of the Springfield, Illinois, division of the Federal Bureau of
15 Investigation, ~~the Executive Director of the Illinois Board of~~
16 ~~Higher Education~~ and the following to be appointed by the
17 Governor: 2 mayors or village presidents of Illinois
18 municipalities, 2 Illinois county sheriffs from counties other
19 than Cook County, 2 managers of Illinois municipalities, 3
20 chiefs of municipal police departments in Illinois having no
21 Superintendent of the Police Department on the Board and 2
22 citizens of Illinois who shall be members of an organized
23 enforcement officers' association which has no other members on

1 the Board other than the chief of a municipal police
2 department, the Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of
3 Investigation, the Director of State Police, a county sheriff
4 or deputy sheriff. The appointments of the Governor shall be
5 made on the first Monday of August in 1965 with 3 of the
6 appointments to be for a period of one year, 3 for 2 years, and
7 3 for 3 years. Their successors shall be appointed in like
8 manner for terms to expire the first Monday of August each 3
9 years thereafter. All members shall serve until their
10 respective successors are appointed and qualify. Vacancies
11 shall be filled by the Governor for the unexpired terms.
