SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that if a special license plate is authorized by law to raise funds for a specific cause and the Secretary of State has not received the required number of applications for that special plate within 2 years of the effective date of the Public Act authorizing the special plate, the Secretary's authority to issue the plate is nullified. Provides that revenues from special license plates shall only benefit designated charitable entities, which must be in compliance with specified requirements. Requires a charitable entity to annually provide the Secretary with a letter of compliance issued by the Attorney General's office, requires the name of the charitable entity which is to receive the funds to be provided to the Secretary within specified time limits, and provides that in the case of a failure to comply with these requirements, the special plates shall be discontinued and any undisbursed funds collected from the sale of plates authorized for that organization shall be transferred to the General Revenue Fund. Provides that if fewer than 1,000 sets of any special plate issued by the Secretary are actively registered for 2 consecutive calendar years, the Secretary may discontinue the issuance of that special plate and that discontinued plates shall be recalled and that owners of vehicles which were registered with recalled plates shall not be charged a reclassification or sticker replacement plate fee upon the issuance of new plates. Makes various changes in provisions concerning moneys collected under provisions creating special plates. Repeals provisions creating Lewis and Clark Bicentennial special plates. Effective January 1, 2012.

Sec. 3-600. Requirements for issuance of special plates.

14 (a) The Secretary of State shall issue only special plates that have been authorized by the General Assembly. The 15 16 Secretary of State shall not issue a series of special plates 17 unless applications, as prescribed by the Secretary, have been received for 10,000 plates of that series; except that the 18 19 Secretary of State may prescribe some other required number of applications if that number is sufficient to pay for the total 20 21 cost of designing, manufacturing and issuing the special 22 license plate. Where a special plate is authorized by law to raise funds for a specific civic group, charitable entity, or 23

other identified organization, and where the Secretary of State has not received the required number of applications to issue that special plate within 2 years of the effective date of the Public Act authorizing the special plate, the Secretary of State's authority to issue the special plate is nullified.

6 (b) The Secretary of State, upon issuing a new series of 7 special license plates, shall notify all law enforcement 8 officials of the design, color and other special features of 9 the special license plate series.

10 (c) This Section shall not apply to special license plate 11 categories in existence on the effective date of this 12 amendatory Act of 1990, or to the Secretary of State's 13 discretion as established in Section 3-611.

14 (d) If a law authorizing a special license plate provides that the sponsoring organization is to designate a charitable 15 16 entity as the recipient of the funds from the sale of that 17 license plate, the designated charitable entity must be in compliance with the registration and reporting requirements of 18 19 the Charitable Trust Act and the Solicitation for Charity Act. 20 In addition, the charitable entity must annually provide the Secretary of State's office a letter of compliance issued by 21 22 the Illinois Attorney General's office verifying the entity is 23 in compliance with the Acts.

In the case of a law in effect before the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 97th General Assembly, the name of the charitable entity which is to receive the funds shall be

1	provided to the Secretary of State within one year after the
2	effective date of this amendatory Act of the 97th General
3	Assembly. In the case of a law that takes effect on or after
4	the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 97th General
5	Assembly, the name of the charitable entity which is to receive

Sec. 3-634. Illinois Fire Fighters' License Plate.

5 (a) The Secretary, upon receipt of an application made in 6 the form prescribed by the Secretary of State, may issue special registration plates designated to be Illinois Fire 7 8 Fighters' Memorial license plates. The special plates issued 9 under this Section shall be affixed only to passenger vehicles 10 of the first division, motor vehicles of the second division 11 weighing not more than 8,000 pounds, recreational vehicles as 12 defined in Section 1-169 of this Code, and subject to the staggered registration system. Plates issued under this 13 14 Section shall expire according to the multi-year procedure 15 established by Section 3-414.1 of this Code.

16 (b) The design and color of the plates shall be wholly within the discretion of the Secretary of State. The Secretary 17 18 of State may, in his or her discretion, allow the plates to be issued as vanity plates or personalized in accordance with 19 20 Section 3-405.1 of this Code. The plates are not required to 21 designate "Land of Lincoln", as prescribed in subsection (b) of 22 Section 3-412 of this Code. The Secretary of State shall prescribe stickers or decals as provided under Section 3-412. 23

(c) An applicant shall be charged a \$27 fee for originalissuance in addition to the applicable registration fee. Of

this additional fee, \$15 shall be deposited into the Secretary 1 2 of State Special License Plate Fund and \$12 shall be deposited into the Illinois Fire Fighters' Memorial Fund. For each 3 registration renewal period, a \$17 fee, in addition to the 4 5 appropriate registration fee, shall be charged. Of this fee, \$2 6 shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special License 7 Plate Fund and \$15 shall be deposited into the Illinois Fire 8 Fighters' Memorial Fund.

9 (d) In addition to the purpose specified in Section 10 2-119(n), moneys in the Illinois Fire Fighters' Memorial Fund 11 shall, except as otherwise provided in subsection (e) and 12 subject to appropriation by the General Assembly and 13 <u>distribution</u> approval by the Secretary, be used exclusively for 14 the following purposes:

(1) maintaining the Illinois Fire Fighters' Memorial;

16 (2) holding an annual memorial commemoration and Medal
 17 of Honor ceremony and related activities; and

(3) providing scholarships, for graduate study,
undergraduate study, or both, to children and spouses of
fire fighters killed in the line of duty.

(e) No more than 10% of the annual proceeds of the Illinois
Fire Fighters' Memorial Fund may, subject to appropriation by
the General Assembly and <u>distribution</u> approval by the
Secretary, be used for exhibits for and the maintenance of the
Illinois Fire Fighter Museum.

3 (a) The Secretary, upon receipt of all applicable fees and 4 applications made in the form prescribed by the Secretary, may 5 issue special registration plates designated as Master Mason 6 license plates.

7 The special plates issued under this Section shall be 8 affixed only to passenger vehicles of the first division or 9 motor vehicles of the second division weighing not more than 10 8,000 pounds.

Plates issued under this Section shall expire according to the multi-year procedure established by Section 3-414.1 of this Code.

(b) The design and color of the special plates shall be wholly within the discretion of the Secretary. Appropriate documentation, as determined by the Secretary, shall accompany each application.

(c) An applicant for the special plate shall be charged a \$25 fee for original issuance in addition to the appropriate registration fee. Of this fee, \$10 shall be deposited into the Master Mason Fund and \$15 shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special License Plate Fund, to be used by the Secretary to help defray the administrative processing costs.

For each registration renewal period, a \$25 fee, in addition to the appropriate registration fee, shall be charged. Of this fee, \$23 shall be deposited into the Master Mason Fund
 and \$2 shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special
 License Plate Fund.

(d) The Master Mason Fund is created as a special fund in 4 5 the State treasury. All money in the Master Mason Fund shall be paid, subject to appropriation by the General Assembly and 6 distribution approval by the Secretary, as grants to The 7 Illinois Masonic Foundation for the Prevention of Drug and 8 9 Alcohol Abuse Among Children, Inc., a not-for-profit 10 corporation, for the purpose of providing Model Student 11 Assistance Programs in public and private schools in Illinois. 12 (Source: P.A. 89-620, eff. 1-1-97; 90-14, eff. 7-1-97.)

19 The special plates issued under this Section shall be 20 affixed only to passenger vehicles of the first division or 21 motor vehicles of the second division weighing not more than 22 8,000 pounds.

Plates issued under this Section shall expire according to the multi-year procedure established by Section 3-414.1 of this Code.

1 (b) The design and color of the special plates shall be 2 wholly within the discretion of the Secretary. Appropriate 3 documentation, as determined by the Secretary, shall accompany 4 each application.

5 (c) An applicant for the special plate shall be charged a 6 \$25 fee for original issuance in addition to the appropriate 7 registration fee. Of this fee, \$10 shall be deposited into the 8 Knights of Columbus Fund and \$15 shall be deposited into the 9 Secretary of State Special License Plate Fund, to be used by 10 the Secretary to help defray the administrative processing 11 costs.

For each registration renewal period, a \$25 fee, in addition to the appropriate registration fee, shall be charged. Of this fee, \$23 shall be deposited into the Knights of Columbus Fund and \$2 shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special License Plate Fund.

(d) The Knights of Columbus Fund is created as a special fund in the State treasury. All money in the Knights of Columbus Fund shall be paid, subject to appropriation by the General Assembly and <u>distribution</u> approval by the Secretary, as grants <u>to charitable entities designated</u> for charitable purposes sponsored by the Knights of Columbus.

(a) The Secretary, upon receipt of an application made in 1 2 the form prescribed by the Secretary, may issue special 3 registration plates designated as Mammogram license plates. The special plates issued under this Section shall be affixed 4 5 only to passenger vehicles of the first division and motor 6 vehicles of the second division weighing not more than 8,000 pounds. Plates issued under this Section shall expire according 7 to the multi-year procedure established by Section 3-414.1 of 8 9 this Code.

10 (b) The design and color of the plates is wholly within the 11 discretion of the Secretary, except that the following phrases 12 shall be on the plates: (i) "Mammograms Save Lives" and (ii) 13 "The Susan G. Komen Foundation". The Secretary may allow the plates to be issued as vanity plates or personalized under 14 15 Section 3-405.1 of the Code. The Secretary shall prescribe 16 stickers or decals as provided under Section 3-412 of this 17 Code.

(c) An applicant for the special plate shall be charged a \$25 fee for original issuance in addition to the appropriate registration fee. Of this fee, \$10 shall be deposited into the Mammogram Fund and \$15 shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special License Plate Fund, to be used by the Secretary to help defray the administrative processing costs.

For each registration renewal period, a \$25 fee, in addition to the appropriate registration fee, shall be charged. Of this fee, \$23 shall be deposited into the Mammogram Fund and \$2 shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special
 License Plate Fund.

(d) The Mammogram Fund is created as a special fund in the
State treasury. All money in the Mammogram Fund shall be paid,
subject to appropriation by the General Assembly and
<u>distribution</u> approval by the Secretary, as grants to the Susan
G. Komen Foundation for breast cancer research, education,
screening, and treatment.

12 (a) The Secretary, upon receipt of an application made in 13 the form prescribed by the Secretary, may issue special 14 registration plates designated as Police Memorial Committee 15 license plates. The special plates issued under this Section 16 shall be affixed only to passenger vehicles of the first division and motor vehicles of the second division weighing not 17 more than 8,000 pounds. Plates issued under this Section shall 18 19 expire according to the multi-year procedure established by 20 Section 3-414.1 of this Code.

(b) The design and color of the plates is wholly within the discretion of the Secretary. The Secretary may allow the plates to be issued as vanity plates or personalized under Section 3-405.1 of the Code. The Secretary shall prescribe stickers or decals as provided under Section 3-412 of this Code.

1 (c) An applicant for the special plate shall be charged a 2 \$25 fee for original issuance in addition to the appropriate 3 registration fee. Of this fee, \$10 shall be deposited into the 4 Police Memorial Committee Fund and \$15 shall be deposited into 5 the Secretary of State Special License Plate Fund, to be used 6 by the Secretary to help defray the administrative processing 7 costs.

8 For each registration renewal period, a \$25 fee, in 9 addition to the appropriate registration fee, shall be charged. 10 Of this fee, \$23 shall be deposited into the Police Memorial 11 Committee Fund and \$2 shall be deposited into the Secretary of 12 State Special License Plate Fund.

13 (d) The Police Memorial Committee Fund is created as a 14 special fund in the State treasury. All money in the Police 15 Memorial Committee Fund shall be paid, subject to appropriation 16 by the General Assembly and distribution approval by the 17 Secretary, as grants to the Police Memorial Committee for maintaining a memorial statue, holding an annual memorial 18 19 commemoration, and giving scholarships to children of police 20 officers killed in the line of duty.

(a) The Secretary, upon receipt of an application made inthe form prescribed by the Secretary, may issue special

registration plates designated as Organ Donor Awareness license plates. The special plates issued under this Section shall be affixed only to passenger vehicles of the first division and motor vehicles of the second division weighing not more than 8,000 pounds. Plates issued under this Section shall expire according to the multi-year procedure established by Section 3-414.1 of this Code.

8 (b) The design and color of the plates is wholly within the 9 discretion of the Secretary, except that the phrase "Be An Organ Donor" shall be on the plates, and the design of the 10 11 plates shall incorporate a reference to the Chicago Bears 12 organization and Walter Payton. The Secretary may allow the 13 plates to be issued as vanity plates or personalized under Section 3-405.1 of the Code. The Secretary shall prescribe 14 stickers or decals as provided under Section 3-412 of this 15 16 Code.

(c) An applicant for the special plate shall be charged a \$25 fee for original issuance in addition to the appropriate registration fee. Of this additional fee, \$10 shall be deposited into the Organ Donor Awareness Fund and \$15 shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special License Plate Fund, to be used by the Secretary to help defray the administrative processing costs.

For each registration renewal period, a \$25 fee, in addition to the appropriate registration fee, shall be charged. Of this additional fee, \$23 shall be deposited into the Organ

Donor Awareness Fund and \$2 shall be deposited into the 1 2 Secretary of State Special License Plate Fund.

3 (d) The Organ Donor Awareness Fund is created as a special fund in the State treasury. Subject to appropriation by the 4 5 General Assembly and approval by the Secretary, 50% of the moneys in the Organ Donor Awareness Fund shall be paid as 6 7 grants to the Gift of Hope Organ and Tissue Donor Network 8 Regional Organ Bank of Illinois, and the remaining 50% of the 9 moneys in that fund shall be paid as grants to Mid-America 10 Transplant Services, or pursuant to any alternative 11 distribution ratio mutually agreed upon by these 2 12 organizations.

16 (a) In addition to any other special license plate, the Secretary, upon receipt of all applicable fees and applications 17 made in the form prescribed by the Secretary of State, may 18 issue special registration plates designated as U.S. Marine 19 20 Corps license plates to residents of Illinois who meet 21 eligibility requirements prescribed by the Secretary of State. 22 The special plate issued under this Section shall be affixed only to passenger vehicles of the first division, motorcycles, 23 24 motor vehicles of the second division weighing not more than 25 8,000 pounds, and recreational vehicles as defined by Section

1-169 of this Code. Plates issued under this Section shall
 expire according to the staggered multi-year procedure
 established by Section 3-414.1 of this Code.

(b) The design, color, and format of the plates shall be 4 5 wholly within the discretion of the Secretary of State, except that the U.S. Marine Corps emblem shall appear on the plates. 6 7 The Secretary may, in his or her discretion, allow the plates 8 to be issued as vanity or personalized plates in accordance 9 with Section 3-405.1 of this Code. The plates are not required 10 to designate "Land Of Lincoln", as prescribed in subsection (b) of Section 3-412 of this Code. The Secretary shall prescribe 11 12 the eligibility requirements and, in his or her discretion, 13 shall approve and prescribe stickers or decals as provided under Section 3-412. 14

15 (c) An applicant shall be charged a \$20 fee for original 16 issuance in addition to the applicable registration fee. Of 17 this additional fee, \$15 shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special License Plate Fund and \$5 shall be deposited 18 19 into the Marine Corps Scholarship Fund. For each registration 20 renewal period, a \$20 fee, in addition to the appropriate registration fee, shall be charged. Of this additional fee, \$2 21 22 shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special License 23 Plate Fund and \$18 shall be deposited into the Marine Corps 24 Scholarship Fund.

(d) The Marine Corps Scholarship Fund is created as aspecial fund in the State treasury. All moneys in the Marine

Corps Scholarship Fund shall, subject to appropriation by the 1 2 General Assembly and distribution approval by the Secretary, be 3 used by the Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation, Inc., a recognized charitable organization that meets the requirements 4 5 of Title 26, Section 501(c)(3) of the United States Code, to provide grants for scholarships for higher education. The 6 scholarship recipients must be the children of current or 7 8 former members of the United States Marine Corps who meet the 9 academic, financial, and other requirements established by the Scholarship Foundation. 10 Marine Corps In addition, the 11 recipients must be Illinois residents and must attend a college 12 or university located within the State of Illinois.

13 State Treasurer shall require the Marine Corps The 14 Scholarship Foundation to establish a separate account for 15 receipt of the proceeds of the Marine Corps Scholarship Fund. 16 That account shall be subject to audit either annually or at 17 another interval, as determined by the State Treasurer. Proceeds from the Marine Corps Scholarship Fund shall be 18 19 transferred on a quarterly basis by the State Treasurer's 20 office to this separate account.

6 The special plates issued under this Section shall be 7 affixed only to passenger vehicles of the first division or 8 motor vehicles of the second division weighing not more than 9 8,000 pounds.

Plates issued under this Section shall expire according to the multi-year procedure established by Section 3-414.1 of this Code.

(b) The design and color of the special plates shall be wholly within the discretion of the Secretary. Appropriate documentation, as determined by the Secretary, shall accompany each application. The Secretary may allow the plates to be issued as vanity plates or personalized plates under Section 3-405.1 of this Code. The Secretary shall prescribe stickers or decals as provided under Section 3-412 of this Code.

(c) An applicant for the special plate shall be charged a \$25 fee for original issuance in addition to the appropriate registration fee. Of this fee, \$10 shall be deposited into the Chicago and Northeast Illinois District Council of Carpenters Fund and \$15 shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special License Plate Fund, to be used by the Secretary to help defray the administrative processing costs. All moneys in the Chicago and Northeast Illinois 10 District Council of Carpenters Fund shall be paid, subject to 11 appropriation by the General Assembly and distribution 12 approval by the Secretary, as grants to charitable entities designated for charitable purposes sponsored by the Chicago and 13 Northeast Illinois District Council of Carpenters. 14

The special plates issued under this Section shall be affixed
only to passenger vehicles of the first division or motor
vehicles of the second division weighing not more than 8,000

pounds. Plates issued under this Section shall expire according to the multi-year procedure established by Section 3-414.1 of this Code.

(b) The design and color of the special plates shall be 4 wholly within the discretion of the Secretary. The Secretary 5 may, in his or her discretion, allow the plates to be issued as 6 vanity or personalized plates in accordance with Section 7 8 3-405.1 of this Code. The plates are not required to designate 9 "Land of Lincoln", as prescribed in subsection (b) of Section 10 3-412 of this Code. The Secretary, in his or her discretion, 11 shall approve and prescribe stickers or decals as provided 12 under Section 3-412.

(c) An applicant for the special plate shall be charged a \$40 fee for original issuance in addition to the appropriate registration fee. Of this fee, \$25 shall be deposited into the Public Broadcasting Fund and \$15 shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special License Plate Fund, to be used by the Secretary to help defray the administrative processing costs.

For each registration renewal period, a \$27 fee, in addition to the appropriate registration fee, shall be charged. Of this fee, \$25 shall be deposited into the Public Broadcasting Fund and \$2 shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special License Plate Fund.
