

1 AN ACT concerning public employee benefits.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**  
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Illinois Pension Code is amended by changing  
5 Section 16-118 as follows:

6 (40 ILCS 5/16-118) (from Ch. 108 1/2, par. 16-118)

7 Sec. 16-118. Retirement. "Retirement": Entry upon a  
8 retirement annuity or receipt of a single-sum retirement  
9 benefit granted under this Article after termination of active  
10 service as a teacher.

11 (a) An annuitant receiving a retirement annuity other than  
12 a disability retirement annuity may accept employment as a  
13 teacher from a school board or other employer specified in  
14 Section 16-106 without impairing retirement status, if that  
15 employment: (1) is not within the school year during which  
16 service was terminated; and (2) does not exceed 100 paid days  
17 or 500 paid hours in any school year (during the period  
18 beginning July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2011, 120 paid days or  
19 600 paid hours in each school year). Where such permitted  
20 employment is partly on a daily and partly on an hourly basis,  
21 a day shall be considered as 5 hours.

22 (b) Subsection (a) does not apply to an annuitant who  
23 returns to teaching under the program established in Section

1 16-150.1, for the duration of his or her participation in that  
2 program.

3 (c) Subsection (a) shall not be construed to authorize  
4 multiple annuitants, without impairing their retirement  
5 status, to accept employment with a school district or other  
6 employer in order to fill, as a group, a teaching position that  
7 would ordinarily be occupied by an active participant. Instead,  
8 if a school board or other employer determines that there is a  
9 subject or administrative position shortage that would require  
10 that action, then it must apply for an exemption under Section  
11 16-150.1.
