2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing
Section 12-610.2 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/12-610.2)

Sec. 12-610.2. Electronic communication devices.

As used in this Section, Section: "Electronic 8 (a) 9 communication device" means an electronic device, including but not limited to a hand-held wireless telephone, hand-held 10 personal digital assistant, or a portable or mobile computer 11 while being used for the purpose of composing, reading, or 12 sending an electronic message, but does not include a global 13 14 positioning system or navigation system or a device that is physically or electronically integrated into the motor 15 16 vehicle.

17 "Electronic message" means a self contained piece of 18 digital communication that is designed or intended to be 19 transmitted between physical devices. "Electronic message" 20 includes, but is not limited to electronic mail, a text 21 message, an instant message, or a command or request to access 22 an Internet site.

(b) A person may not operate a motor vehicle on a roadway

while using an electronic communication device to compose,
 send, or read an electronic message.

3 (c) A violation of this Section is an offense against
4 traffic regulations governing the movement of vehicles. <u>A</u>
5 person who violates this Section shall be fined a maximum of
6 <u>\$75 for a first offense, \$100 for a second offense, \$125 for a</u>
7 third offense, and \$150 for a fourth or subsequent offense.

(d) This Section does not apply to:

9 (1) a law enforcement officer or operator of an 10 emergency vehicle while performing his or her official 11 duties;

12 (2) a driver using an electronic communication device 13 for the sole purpose of reporting an emergency situation 14 and continued communication with emergency personnel 15 during the emergency situation;

16 (3) a driver using an electronic communication device 17 in hands-free or <u>voice-operated</u> voice activated mode<u>,</u> 18 <u>which may include the use of a headset</u>;

19 (4) a driver of a commercial motor vehicle reading a 20 message displayed on a permanently installed communication 21 device designed for a commercial motor vehicle with a 22 screen that does not exceed 10 inches tall by 10 inches 23 wide in size;

(5) a driver using an electronic communication device
 while parked on the shoulder of a roadway; or
