1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 4866 2 AMENDMENT NO. . Amend House Bill 4866 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following: 3 "Section 5. The Motor Fuel Sales Act is amended by changing 4 Section 2 as follows: 5 6 (815 ILCS 365/2) (from Ch. 121 1/2, par. 1502) 7 Sec. 2. Assistance at stations with self-service and full-service islands. 8 (a) Any attendant on duty at a gasoline station or service 9 10 station offering to the public retail sales of motor fuel at 11 both self-service and full-service islands shall, upon 12 request, dispense motor fuel for the driver of a car which is

parked at a self-service island and displays: (1) registration

plates issued to a physically disabled person pursuant to

Section 3-616 of the Illinois Vehicle Code; (2) registration

plates issued to a disabled veteran pursuant to Section 3-609

- or 3-609.01 of such Code; or (3) a special decal or device issued pursuant to Section 11-1301.2 of such Code; and shall only charge such driver prices as offered to the general public for motor fuel dispensed at the self-service island. However, such attendant shall not be required to perform other services which are offered at the full-service island.
 - (b) Gasoline stations and service stations in this State are subject to the federal Americans with Disabilities Act and must:
 - (1) provide refueling assistance upon the request of an individual with a disability (A gasoline station or service station is not required to provide such service at any time that it is operating on a remote control basis with a single employee, but is encouraged to do so, if feasible.);
 - of a fueling site, a direct telephone number to the gasoline station or service station that will allow a disabled operator of a motor vehicle to request refueling assistance accompanied by the universal wheelchair symbol and the following statement: "If you are a person with a disability, display a disability placard or license plate, and need assistance refueling your vehicle, you may contact a station attendant by phone directly at XXX-XXXX-XXXX." let patrons know, through appropriate signs, that customers with disabilities can obtain refueling assistance by either honking or otherwise signaling an employee; and

- 1 (3) provide the refueling assistance without any charge beyond the self-serve price.
 - (c) The signage required under paragraph (2) of subsection (b) shall be designated by the station owner and shall be posted in a prominently visible place. The sign shall be clearly visible to customers.
 - (d) The Secretary of State shall provide to persons with disabilities information regarding the availability of refueling assistance under this Section by the following methods:
 - (1) by posting information about that availability on the Secretary of State's Internet website, along with a link to the Department of Human Services website; and
 - (2) by publishing a brochure containing information about that availability, which shall be made available at all Secretary of State offices throughout the State.
 - (e) The Department of Human Services shall post on its Internet website information regarding the availability of refueling assistance for persons with disabilities and the addresses and telephone numbers of all gasoline and service stations in Illinois.
 - (f) A person commits a Class C misdemeanor if he or she telephones a gasoline station or service station to request refueling assistance and he or she:
- 25 (1) is not actually physically present at the gasoline 26 or service station; or

- 1 (2) is physically present at the gasoline or service station but 2 does not actually require refueling 3 assistance.
 - The Department of Transportation shall work in cooperation with appropriate representatives of gasoline and service station trade associations and the petroleum industry to increase the signage at gasoline and service stations on interstate highways in this State with regard to the availability of refueling assistance for persons with disabilities.
- 11 (h) An owner who owns a gas station or service station, a landlord who owns the land or facility that houses a gas 12 13 station or service station, a tenant who owns or operates the 14 gas station or service station (collectively "owner or 15 operator"), and a franchisor or other parent entity ("franchisor") are all jointly and severally subject to the 16 requirements of this Act. An owner or operator who fails to 17 comply with this Act is guilty of a Class C misdemeanor and 18 shall pay a fine of not less than \$300 nor more than \$600 per 19 20 violation per location. A franchisor who fails to comply with 21 this Act is guilty of a Class C misdemeanor and shall pay a 22 fine of not less than \$200 nor more than \$400 per violation per 23 location.
