

97TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2011 and 2012 HB5676

Introduced 2/16/2012, by Rep. Jim Watson

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 1605/7.12 20 ILCS 1605/7.18 new

Amends the Illinois Lottery Law. Provides that, if the Internet pilot program becomes operational, the commissions paid to sales agents may not be reduced to a rate of less than 5%. Requires that Lottery tickets under the Internet Lottery program be purchased through the use of stored value cards authorized by the Department; however, an individual may add his or her prize on a winning ticket to a stored value card. Prohibits the purchase of Lottery tickets or the stored value cards under the Internet Lottery program using credit cards. Specifies that the stored value cards may only be purchased with cash by an individual 18 years of age or older. Provides that Internet Lottery prizes of up to \$600 must be redeemed at a licensed retail sales agent. Effective immediately.

AN ACT concerning the lottery. 1

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Lottery Law is amended by changing
- 5 Section 7.12 and by adding Section 7.18 as follows:

- 9 (1) the consumer market in Illinois has changed since
- the creation of the Illinois State Lottery in 1974; 10

- everyday life for a significant number of 13 residents not only in regards to their professional life,

- 16 (3) the current practices of selling lottery tickets
- 17 does not appeal to the new form of market participants who
- prefer to make purchases on the internet at their own 18
- 19 convenience.
- 20 It is the intent of the General Assembly to create an
- 21 Internet pilot program for the sale of lottery tickets to
- 22 capture this new form of market participant.
- The Department shall create a pilot program that allows an 2.3

individual 18 years of age or older to purchase lottery tickets or shares on the Internet without using a Lottery retailer with on-line status, as those terms are defined by rule. The Department shall restrict the sale of lottery tickets on the Internet to transactions initiated and received or otherwise made exclusively within the State of Illinois. The Department shall adopt rules necessary for the administration of this program. These rules shall include requirements for marketing of the Lottery to infrequent players. The provisions of this Act and the rules adopted under this Act shall apply to the sale of lottery tickets or shares under this program.

Before beginning the pilot program, the Department of the Lottery must submit a request to the United States Department of Justice for review of the State's plan to implement a pilot program for the sale of lottery tickets on the Internet and its propriety under federal law. The Department shall implement the Internet pilot program only if the Department of Justice does not object to the implementation of the program within a reasonable period of time after its review.

The Department is obligated to implement the pilot program set forth in this Section and Sections 7.15 and 7.16 only at such time, and to such extent, that the Department of Justice does not object to the implementation of the program within a reasonable period of time after its review. While the Illinois Lottery may only offer Lotto and Mega Millions games through the pilot program, the Department shall request review from the

1 federal Department of Justice for the Illinois Lottery to sell

2 lottery tickets on the Internet on behalf of the State of

3 Illinois that are not limited to just these games.

The Department shall authorize the private manager to implement and administer the program pursuant to the management agreement entered into under Section 9.1 and in a manner consistent with the provisions of this Section. If a private manager has not been selected pursuant to Section 9.1 at the time the Department is obligated to implement the pilot program, then the Department shall not proceed with the pilot program until after the selection of the private manager, at which time the Department shall authorize the private manager to implement and administer the program pursuant to the management agreement entered into under Section 9.1 and in a manner consistent with the provisions of this Section.

The pilot program shall last for not less than 36 months, but not more than 48 months from the date of its initial operation.

Nothing in this Section shall be construed as prohibiting the Department from implementing and operating a website portal whereby individuals who are 18 years of age or older with an Illinois mailing address may apply to purchase lottery tickets via subscription.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Law, if the program authorized under this Section becomes operational, the commissions paid to sales agents licensed under the provision

- of this Law may not be reduced to a rate of less than 5%.
