

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**  
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 5. The amount of \$13,091,050, or so much thereof  
6 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the  
7 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of  
8 Representatives for furnishing the items provided in Section  
9 4 of the General Assembly Compensation Act to members of  
10 their respective houses throughout the year in connection  
11 with their legislative duties and responsibilities and not in  
12 connection with any political campaign as prescribed by law.  
13 Of this amount, 37.436% is appropriated to the President of  
14 the Senate for such expenditures and 62.564% is appropriated  
15 to the Speaker of the House for such expenditures.

16 Section 10. Payments from the amounts appropriated in  
17 Section 5 hereof shall be made only upon the delivery of a  
18 voucher approved by the member to the State Comptroller. The  
19 voucher shall also be approved by the President of the Senate  
20 or the Speaker of the House of Representatives as the case  
21 may be.

1           Section 15. The amount of \$20,338,646 or so much thereof  
2 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to meet  
3 the ordinary and incidental expenses of the Senate  
4 legislative leadership and legislative staff assistants and  
5 the House Majority and Minority leadership staff, general  
6 staff and office operations. Of this amount, 24.73% is  
7 appropriated to the President of the Senate for such  
8 expenditures, 26.04% is appropriated to the Senate Minority  
9 Leader for such expenditures and 25.12% is appropriated to  
10 the Speaker of the House for such expenditures, and 24.11% is  
11 appropriated to the House Minority Leader for such  
12 expenditures.

13           Section 20. The amount of \$9,382,100, or so much thereof  
14 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the  
15 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of  
16 Representatives for the ordinary and incidental expenses of  
17 committees, the general staff and operations, per diem  
18 employees, special and standing committees, expenses incurred  
19 in transcribing and printing of debates. Of this amount,  
20 43.018% is appropriated to the President of the Senate for  
21 such expenditures and 56.982% is appropriated to the Speaker  
22 of the House for such expenditures.

1           Section 25. The amount of \$309,200, or so much thereof  
2 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the  
3 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of  
4 Representatives for the ordinary and incidental expenses,  
5 also including the purchasing on contract as required by law  
6 of printing, binding, printing paper, stationery and office  
7 supplies. For the House, no part of which shall be expended  
8 for expenses of purchasing, handling or distributing such  
9 supplies and against which no indebtedness shall be incurred  
10 without the written approval of the Speaker of the House of  
11 Representatives. Of this amount, 69.277% is appropriated to  
12 the President of the Senate for such expenditures and 30.723%  
13 is appropriated to the Speaker of the House for such  
14 expenditures.

15           Section 30. The amount of \$4,378,008, or so much thereof  
16 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the  
17 President of the Senate for the use of standing committees  
18 for expert witnesses, technical services, consulting  
19 assistance and other research assistance associated with  
20 special studies and long range research projects which may be  
21 requested by the standing committees and the Speaker of the  
22 House of Representatives for Standing House Committees  
23 pursuant to the Legislative Commission Reorganization Act of  
24 1984. Of this amount, 45.587% is appropriated to the

1 President of the Senate for such expenditures and 54.413% is  
2 appropriated to the Speaker of the House for such  
3 expenditures.

4 Section 35. The amount of \$162,825, or so much thereof  
5 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the  
6 President of the Senate and the Senate Minority Leader for  
7 allowances for the particular and additional services  
8 appertaining to or entailed by the respective officers of the  
9 Senate. Of this amount, 48.7% is appropriated to the  
10 President of the Senate for such expenditures and 51.3% is  
11 appropriated to the Senate Minority Leader for such  
12 expenditures.

13 Section 40. The amount of \$88,100, or so much thereof as  
14 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the  
15 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of  
16 Representatives for travel, including expenses to Springfield  
17 of members on official legislative business during weeks when  
18 the General Assembly is not in session. Of this amount,  
19 65.5% is appropriated to the President of the Senate for such  
20 expenditures and 34.5% is appropriated to the Speaker of the  
21 House for such expenditures.

22 Section 45. The amount of \$441,600, or so much thereof

1 as may be necessary and remains unexpended from an  
2 appropriation heretofore made for such purposes in Article  
3 70, Section 45 of Public Act 96-956, is appropriated to the  
4 Speaker of the House for expenses in connection with the  
5 planning and preparation of redistricting of legislative and  
6 representative districts as required by Article IV, Section 3  
7 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970.

8 Section 50. The amount of \$341,600, or so much thereof  
9 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue  
10 Fund to the General Assembly to meet ordinary and contingent  
11 expenses. Any use of funds appropriated under this Section  
12 must be approved jointly by the Clerk of the House of  
13 Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate.

14 Section 55. As used in Section 15 hereof, except where  
15 the approval of the Speaker of the House of Representatives  
16 is expressively required for the expenditure of or the  
17 incurring of indebtedness against an appropriation for  
18 certain purchases on contract, "Speaker" means the leader of  
19 the party having the largest number of members of the House  
20 of Representatives as of January 14, 2009, and "Minority  
21 Leader" means the leader of the party having the second  
22 largest number of members of the House of Representatives as  
23 of January 14, 2009.

1           Section 60. The sum of \$113,700, or so much thereof as  
2 may be necessary, is appropriated for the ordinary and  
3 contingent expenses of the Senate Operations Commission  
4 including the planning costs, construction costs, moving  
5 expenses and all other costs associated with the construction  
6 and reconstruction of Senate offices in the Capitol Complex  
7 area.

8           Section 65. The amount of \$750,000, or so much thereof  
9 as may be necessary and remains unexpended from an  
10 appropriation heretofore made for such purposes in Article  
11 70, Section 70 of Public Act 96-956, is appropriated to the  
12 President of the Senate for expenses in connection with the  
13 planning and preparation of redistricting of legislative and  
14 representative districts as required by Article IV, Section 3  
15 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970.

16           Section 70. The amount of \$750,000, or so much thereof  
17 as may be necessary and remains unexpended from an  
18 appropriation heretofore made for such purposes in Article  
19 70, Section 70 of Public Act 96-956, is appropriated to the  
20 Minority Leader of the Senate for expenses in connection with  
21 the planning and preparation of redistricting of legislative  
22 and representative districts as required by Article IV,

1 Section 3 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970.

2 Section 75. The amount of \$750,000, or so much thereof  
3 as may be necessary and remains unexpended from an  
4 appropriation heretofore made for such purposes in Article  
5 70, Section 75 of Public Act 96-956, is appropriated to the  
6 Speaker of the House of Representatives for expenses in  
7 connection with the planning and preparation of redistricting  
8 of legislative and representative districts as required by  
9 Article IV, Section 3 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970.

10 Section 80. The amount of \$750,000, or so much thereof  
11 as may be necessary and remains unexpended from an  
12 appropriation heretofore made for such purposes in Article  
13 70, Section 75 of Public Act 96-956, is appropriated to the  
14 Minority Speaker of the House of Representatives for expenses  
15 in connection with the planning and preparation of  
16 redistricting of legislative and representative districts as  
17 required by Article IV, Section 3 of the Illinois  
18 Constitution of 1970.

19 Section 85. The amount of \$500,000, or so much thereof  
20 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated from the  
21 General Assembly Operations Revolving Fund to the President  
22 of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives

1 to meet ordinary and contingent expenses. Of this amount,  
2 50% is appropriated to the President of the Senate for such  
3 expenditures and 50% is appropriated to the Speaker of the  
4 House for such expenditures.

5 ARTICLE 2

6 Section 5. The amount of \$3,932,900, or so much thereof  
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue  
8 Fund to the Commission on Government Forecasting and  
9 Accountability to meet its operational expenses for the  
10 fiscal year ending June 30, 2012.

11 ARTICLE 3

12 Section 5. The amount of \$2,160,000, or so much thereof  
13 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue  
14 Fund to the Legislative Printing Unit to meet its operational  
15 expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012.

16 ARTICLE 4

17 Section 5. The amount of \$233,500, or so much thereof as  
18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue  
19 Fund to the Legislative Audit Commission to meet its



1 operational expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30,  
2 2012.

3 ARTICLE 5

4 Section 5. The amount of \$2,930,950, or so much thereof  
5 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue  
6 Fund to the Legislative Research Unit to meet its operational  
7 expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012.

8 ARTICLE 6

9 Section 5. The amount of \$2,489,400, or so much thereof  
10 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue  
11 Fund to the Legislative Reference Bureau to meet its  
12 operational expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30,  
13 2012.

14 ARTICLE 7

15 Section 5. The amount of \$1,040,700, or so much thereof  
16 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue  
17 Fund to the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules to meet  
18 its operational expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30,  
19 2012.

1 ARTICLE 8

2 Section 5. The amount of \$5,166,700, or so much thereof  
3 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue  
4 Fund to the Legislative Information System to meet its  
5 operational expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30,  
6 2012.

7 Section 10. The following amount, or so much of that  
8 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General  
9 Assembly Computer Equipment Revolving Fund to the Legislative  
10 Information System:

11 For Purchase, Maintenance, and Rental of  
12 General Assembly Electronic Data Processing  
13 Equipment and for other operational  
14 purposes of the General Assembly .....1,600,000

15 ARTICLE 9

16 Section 60. The sum of \$312,455, or so much thereof as  
17 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Legislative Ethics  
18 Commission to meet the ordinary and contingent expenses of  
19 the Commission and the Office of Legislative Inspector  
20 General.

ARTICLE 10

Section 5. The amount of \$1,669,500, or so much thereof  
3 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue  
4 Fund to the Architect of the Capitol to meet its operational  
5 expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012.

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Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,  
7 2011.
