1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 1849

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 1849 by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Coal Mining Act is amended by changing
5 Sections 5.11, 6.10, and 6.11 and by adding Section 1.25 as
6 follows:

7 (225 ILCS 705/1.25 new)

8 Sec. 1.25. Recorder. "Recorder" means a person trained and
9 designated by the operator as the individual responsible for
10 recording the mine examiner's examination of the underground
11 workings of the mine.

12 (225 ILCS 705/5.11) (from Ch. 96 1/2, par. 511)

13 Sec. 5.11. To see that a mine examiner makes the
14 examinations provided in Articles 5, 6, and 31 of this Act, and
15 that he or she enters his or her report either by calling it

1 out to the surface to a recorder or by personally recording the
2 report. The recorder or mine examiner shall record the report
3 in a book or computer system that is provided by the operator
4 for that purpose, and the book or computer system shall be
5 secure and not susceptible to alteration. ~~thereof with~~
6 ~~indelible pencil or ink in a well bound or properly protected~~
7 ~~loose leaf book provided by the operator for that purpose.~~

9 (225 ILCS 705/6.10) (from Ch. 96 1/2, par. 610)

10 Sec. 6.10. Upon completing his or her examination, he or
11 she shall make a daily record of the same either by calling out
12 the results of the examination to a recorder or by personally
13 recording the report. The recorder or mine examiner shall
14 record the report in a book or computer system that is provided
15 by the operator for that purpose, and the book or computer
16 system shall be secure and not susceptible to alteration. The
17 mine examination report is ~~in a book kept for that purpose,~~ for
18 the information of the company, the State Mine Inspector, and
19 all other persons interested; and this report ~~record~~ shall be
20 recorded ~~made each morning~~ before the miners are permitted to
21 enter the mine.

23 (225 ILCS 705/6.11) (from Ch. 96 1/2, par. 611)

24 Sec. 6.11. Should any dangerous conditions be found as

1 described in Section 6.09, he or she shall call the conditions
2 out to a recorder or shall personally record the report. The
3 recorder or mine examiner shall record the report in a book or
4 computer system that is provided by the operator for that
5 purpose, and the book or computer system shall be secure and
6 not susceptible to alteration. The recorder or mine examiner
7 shall ensure that the report sets ~~record the same in the daily~~
8 ~~record book of examinations, setting~~ forth the nature of the
9 conditions found and the location of same.
