SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

110 ILCS 305/25
110 ILCS 520/15
110 ILCS 660/5-120
110 ILCS 665/10-120
110 ILCS 670/15-120

110 ILCS 690/35-125

Amends various Acts relating to the governance of public universities in Illinois. Provides that, subject to appropriation to offset the costs, for the 2014-2015, 2015-2016, and 2016-2017 academic years, the tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident pursuing a major in a science, technology, engineering, or mathematics field of study must not exceed the tuition amount charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident for the 2013-2014 academic year. Provides that if money is not appropriated in a given fiscal year to offset the costs of this freeze on the tuition rate, then the governing board of the university, for that particular academic year, is authorized to charge a lesser amount of tuition to students who are Illinois residents pursuing a major in a science, technology, engineering, or mathematics field of study than the tuition charged students who are Illinois residents pursuing majors in other fields of study.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning education.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The University of Illinois Act is amended by
5 changing Section 25 as follows:

6 (110 ILCS 305/25)

7 Sec. 25. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section
8 applies only to those students who first enroll after the
9 2003-2004 academic year. For 4 continuous academic years
10 following initial enrollment (or for undergraduate programs
11 that require more than 4 years to complete, for the normal time
12 to complete the program, as determined by the University), the
13 tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois
14 resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was
15 charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University.
16 However, if the student changes majors during this time period,
17 the tuition charged the student shall equal the amount the
18 student would have been charged had he or she been admitted to
19 the changed major when he or she first enrolled. An
20 undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident and who has
21 for 4 continuous academic years been charged no more than the
22 tuition amount that he or she was charged at the time he or she
23 first enrolled in the University shall be charged tuition not

1 to exceed the amount the University charged students who first
2 enrolled in the University for the academic year following the
3 academic year the student first enrolled in the University for
4 a maximum of 2 additional continuous academic years.

5 Subject to appropriation to offset the costs, for the
6 2014-2015, 2015-2016, and 2016-2017 academic years, the
7 tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois
8 resident pursuing a major in a science, technology,
9 engineering, or mathematics field of study must not exceed the
10 tuition amount charged an undergraduate student who is an
11 Illinois resident for the 2013-2014 academic year. If money is
12 not appropriated in a given fiscal year to offset the costs of
13 this freeze on the tuition rate, then the Board of Trustees,
14 for that particular academic year, is authorized to charge a
15 lesser amount of tuition to students who are Illinois residents
16 pursuing a major in a science, technology, engineering, or
17 mathematics field of study than the tuition charged students
18 who are Illinois residents pursuing majors in other fields of
19 study.

22 Act is amended by changing Section 15 as follows:

24 Sec. 15. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section

1 applies only to those students who first enroll after the
2 2003-2004 academic year. For 4 continuous academic years
3 following initial enrollment (or for undergraduate programs
4 that require more than 4 years to complete, for the normal time
5 to complete the program, as determined by the University), the
6 tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois
7 resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was
8 charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University.
9 However, if the student changes majors during this time period,
10 the tuition charged the student shall equal the amount the
11 student would have been charged had he or she been admitted to
12 the changed major when he or she first enrolled. An
13 undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident and who has
14 for 4 continuous academic years been charged no more than the
15 tuition amount that he or she was charged at the time he or she
16 first enrolled in the University shall be charged tuition not

19 to complete the program, as determined by the University), the
20 tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois
21 resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was
22 charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University.
23 However, if the student changes majors during this time period,
24 the tuition charged the student shall equal the amount the

1 student would have been charged had he or she been admitted to
2 the changed major when he or she first enrolled. An
3 undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident and who has

9 to complete the program, as determined by the University), the
10 tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois
11 resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was
12 charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University.
13 However, if the student changes majors during this time period,
14 the tuition charged the student shall equal the amount the
15 student would have been charged had he or she been admitted to
16 the changed major when he or she first enrolled. An
17 undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident and who has

18 charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University.
19 However, if the student changes majors during this time period,
20 the tuition charged the student shall equal the amount the
21 student would have been charged had he or she been admitted to

9 resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was
10 charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University.
11 However, if the student changes majors during this time period,
12 the tuition charged the student shall equal the amount the
13 student would have been charged had he or she been admitted to

21 to complete the program, as determined by the University), the
22 tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois
23 resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was
24 charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University.

1 However, if the student changes majors during this time period,
2 the tuition charged the student shall equal the amount the
3 student would have been charged had he or she been admitted to
4 the changed major when he or she first enrolled. An
5 undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident and who has

9 following initial enrollment (or for undergraduate programs
10 that require more than 4 years to complete, for the normal time
11 to complete the program, as determined by the University), the
12 tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois
13 resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was
14 charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University.
15 However, if the student changes majors during this time period,
16 the tuition charged the student shall equal the amount the
17 student would have been charged had he or she been admitted to
18 the changed major when he or she first enrolled. An
19 undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident and who has
20 for 4 continuous academic years been charged no more than the
21 tuition amount that he or she was charged at the time he or she
22 first enrolled in the University shall be charged tuition not
