A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**  
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 20. The sum of \$30,000, or so much thereof as  
 6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Oil Spill Response  
 7 Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for use in  
 8 accordance with Section 25c-1 of the Environmental Protection  
 9 Act.

10 Section 25. The amount of \$4,000,000, or so much thereof  
 11 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Environmental  
 12 Protection Trust Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency  
 13 for awards and grants as directed by the Environmental  
 14 Protection Trust Fund Commission.
