

1 AN ACT concerning regulation.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Illinois Dead Animal Disposal Act is amended
5 by changing Sections 1.1, 4, 6, 9.1, 9.2, 9.3, 12, and 18 as
6 follows:

7 (225 ILCS 610/1.1) (from Ch. 8, par. 149.1)

8 Sec. 1.1. As used in this Act, unless the context otherwise
9 requires:

10 (a) "Department" means the Department of Agriculture of the
11 State of Illinois.

12 (b) "Person" means any individual, firm, partnership,
13 association, corporation or other business entity.

14 (c) "Renderer" means any person who, for other than human
15 consumption, collects, cooks and processes bodies or parts of
16 bodies of dead animals, poultry or fish, or used cooking grease
17 and oils, for the purpose of salvaging hides, wool, skins or
18 feathers, and for the production of animal, poultry, or fish
19 protein, blood meal, bone meal, grease or tallow.

20 (d) "Blender" means any person who acquires inedible
21 by-products of bodies or parts of bodies of dead animals,
22 poultry or fish, or used cooking grease and oils, for the
23 purpose of blending them to obtain a desired percentage of

1 protein, degree of quality or color for use in animal feed,
2 poultry feed or fertilizers.

3 (e) "Collection center" means any place where bodies or
4 parts of bodies of dead animals, poultry or fish, or used
5 cooking grease and cooking oils, are collected for loading into
6 a permitted vehicle for delivery to the renderer.

7 (f) "Permittee" means any person issued a vehicle permit
8 under the provisions of this Act.

9 (g) "Licensee" means any person licensed under the
10 provisions of this Act.

11 (h) "Rendering materials" means bodies or parts of bodies
12 of dead animals, poultry or fish, or used cooking grease and
13 oils.

14 (i) "Animal collection service" means a company that
15 conveys dead animals to a landfill facility licensed under the
16 Environmental Protection Act when no rendering service is
17 available. Waste haulers collecting waste in which a dead
18 animal is included incidental to such waste shall not be
19 considered an "animal collection service" activity.

20 (j) "Grease and oil collector" means any person who
21 collects for reuse or recycling used cooking grease and cooking
22 oils in a permitted vehicle for delivery to a grease and
23 cooking oil processor for purposes other than rendering or
24 blending.

25 (k) "Grease and oil processor" means any person who stores,
26 filters, processes, or distributes for reuse or recycling used

1 cooking grease and cooking oils for uses other than rendering
2 or blending.

4 (225 ILCS 610/4) (from Ch. 8, par. 152)

5 Sec. 4. Application for such license shall be made to the
6 Department on forms provided by it, which application shall set
7 forth the name and residence of the applicant, classification
8 of license or licenses requested, his place or proposed place
9 of business, and the particular method which he intends to
10 employ in disposing of rendering material and such other
11 information as the Department may require. The licenses shall
12 be classified according to type of plant operated. Renderer:
13 Class "A"--dead animals only; Class "B"--parts of bodies of
14 animals, scrap, bones, fat, used cooking grease and oils; Class
15 "C"--poultry or parts of poultry and Class "D"--fish or parts
16 of fish; Blender: Class "E"; Collection Center: Class "F";
17 Animal Collection Service: Class "G"; grease and oil processor:
18 Class "H".

20 (225 ILCS 610/6) (from Ch. 8, par. 154)

21 Sec. 6. On the receipt of the certification described in
22 Section 5, and the payment of the fee provided herein, the
23 Department shall issue a license to the applicant to conduct
24 such business at the place specified in the application for one

1 calendar year or for the portion of the calendar year remaining
 2 at the time the license is issued. No license shall be issued
 3 for a plant not located within the boundaries of the State of
 4 Illinois. No license issued under this Section is transferable.

5 The following nonrefundable fees shall accompany each
 6 application for a license.

7 (1) For an original license of any
 8 classification other than Class "F" \$150

9 (2) For the annual renewal of a license
 10 of any classification other than Class "F"..... \$150

11 (3) For an original license for each
 12 additional classification other than Class "F" .. \$50

13 (4) For the annual renewal of the license of
 14 any additional classification
 15 other than Class "F" \$50

16 (5) For an original Class "F" license \$25

17 (6) For the annual renewal
 18 of a Class "F" license \$25

19 (7) For an original Class "G" license \$25

20 (8) For the annual renewal of a Class "G"
 21 license..... \$25

22 (9) For an original Class "H" license \$25

23 (10) For the annual renewal of a Class "H"
 24 license..... \$25

1 (225 ILCS 610/9.1) (from Ch. 8, par. 157.1)

2 Sec. 9.1. Except as otherwise provided in Section 14, no
3 person shall operate a vehicle used to transport rendering
4 materials or used cooking grease or cooking oils in this State
5 without a vehicle permit issued by the Department or without
6 complying with this Act. Applications for vehicle permits shall
7 be accepted only from licensed renderers and grease and oil
8 processors and shall include the name and address of the
9 proposed permittee, the location of the place or intended place
10 of the proposed permittee's business, the number and types of
11 vehicles to be used by the proposed permittee and such other
12 information as may be required by regulations of the
13 Department. Owners or operators of vehicles not owned by
14 licensed renderers or grease and oil processors in this State
15 shall secure a permit through the licensed renderer, ~~or~~
16 renderers, or grease and oil processors to whom the rendering
17 material or used cooking grease and cooking oil will be
18 delivered. The Department shall issue a Class 1 permit for the
19 transporting of dead animals, fish or poultry; a Class 2 permit
20 for transporting parts of bodies of animals, scrap, bones, fat,
21 or used cooking grease and oils; a Class 3 permit for
22 transporting hides; and a Class 4 permit for transporting
23 bodies or parts of bodies of dead animals, poultry or fish to a
24 landfill as an animal collection service. Permits issued
25 hereunder shall be renewable annually during December of each
26 year. All vehicle permits not renewed during December of each

1 year shall expire on December 31 of that year. A \$10 fee shall
2 accompany each application for a vehicle permit or renewal
3 thereof.

5 (225 ILCS 610/9.2) (from Ch. 8, par. 157.2)

6 Sec. 9.2. Each vehicle issued a Class 1 permit shall have
7 the inscription "Illinois Dead Animal Disposal Permit No. ...",
8 as assigned; each truck granted a Class 2 permit shall have the
9 inscription "Illinois Scrap and Grease Permit No. ...", as
10 assigned; and each truck granted a Class 3 permit shall have
11 the inscription "Illinois Hide Permit No. ...", as assigned.
12 All of these inscriptions shall be painted in a conspicuous
13 place in contrasting color on the left side of the bed of the
14 vehicle in letters not less than 3 inches high. If the vehicle
15 transporting the rendering material or used cooking grease and
16 cooking oil or conveying dead animals to a landfill is not a
17 van type truck, the vehicle bed, as well as any properly
18 identified tanks or barrels used for the transportation of
19 rendering material, or used cooking grease and cooking oil when
20 loaded or partially loaded, shall be covered when traveling
21 highways of the State of Illinois. Vehicle beds shall be
22 leak-proof or constructed so that no drippings or seepage can
23 escape.

24 Collection vehicles containing rendering material or used
25 cooking grease and cooking oil or used for transporting dead

1 animals, poultry, fish, or parts of bodies thereof shall be
2 thoroughly scrubbed and disinfected after hauling each load, or
3 before proceeding for another load. All vehicle beds shall be
4 painted as necessary, and kept in good condition and repair at
5 all times.

7 (225 ILCS 610/9.3) (from Ch. 8, par. 157.3)

8 Sec. 9.3. All permittees shall record each collection of
9 rendering materials or used cooking grease and cooking oil,
10 setting forth the date, quantity and description of rendering
11 material or used cooking grease and cooking oil collected, and
12 the person to whom such material was delivered. The permittee
13 shall give a receipt to every person from whom the permittee
14 collects rendering materials or used cooking grease and cooking
15 oil. The original of such records, and a copy of all receipts
16 given by the permittee for rendering material or used cooking
17 grease and cooking oil shall be retained by the permittee until
18 the rendering materials or used cooking grease and cooking oil
19 are delivered to their destination. Thereafter, the record and
20 receipt shall be retained by the permittee for a minimum of 3
21 months and shall be available for inspection by authorized
22 personnel of the Department.

24 (225 ILCS 610/12) (from Ch. 8, par. 160)

1 Sec. 12. The Department shall make such reasonable
2 regulations for the carrying on and conduct of such business as
3 it may deem advisable and all persons engaged in such business
4 shall comply therewith. The Department, or its
5 representatives, in performing the duties vested in it under
6 this Act is empowered to enter, during usual working hours, any
7 premises, buildings, or other places where dead animals or used
8 cooking grease and cooking oil may be found, for the purpose of
9 administering the provisions of this Act.

10 Licensees shall comply with rules, bulletins, manuals of
11 procedure and guidelines pertaining to renderers and blenders
12 and the handling and distribution of condemned or inedible meat
13 or poultry products which implement the federal Meat Inspection
14 Act and the federal Poultry Inspection Act. Such rules,
15 bulletins, manuals and guidelines shall become effective on the
16 date designated by the United States Department of Agriculture.

18 (225 ILCS 610/18) (from Ch. 8, par. 166)

19 Sec. 18. The transportation of bodies or parts of bodies of
20 dead animals, poultry or fish, ~~or used cooking greases and~~
21 ~~oils,~~ raw or unrendered, except green or salted hides, shall
22 not be allowed into other states except by reciprocal
23 agreements with other states under rules of the Department.

1 Section 10. The Criminal Code of 2012 is amended by
2 changing Section 48-7 as follows:

3 (720 ILCS 5/48-7)

4 Sec. 48-7. Feeding garbage to animals.

5 (a) Definitions. As used in this Section:

6 "Department" means the Department of Agriculture of
7 the State of Illinois.

8 "Garbage" has the same meaning as in the federal Swine
9 Health Protection Act (7 U.S.C. 3802) and also includes
10 putrescible vegetable waste. "Garbage" does not include
11 the contents of the bovine digestive tract ~~means~~
12 ~~putrescible vegetable waste, animal, poultry, or fish~~
13 ~~carcasses or parts thereof resulting from the handling,~~
14 ~~preparation, cooking, or consumption of food, but does not~~
15 ~~include the contents of the bovine digestive tract.~~
16 ~~"Garbage" also means the bodies or parts of bodies of~~
17 ~~animals, poultry or fish.~~

18 "Person" means any person, firm, partnership,
19 association, corporation, or other legal entity, any
20 public or private institution, the State, or any municipal
21 corporation or political subdivision of the State.

22 (b) A person commits feeding garbage to animals when he or
23 she feeds or permits the feeding of garbage to swine or any
24 animals or poultry on any farm or any other premises where
25 swine are kept.

1 (c) Establishments licensed under the Illinois Dead Animal
2 Disposal Act or under similar laws in other states are exempt
3 from the provisions of this Section.

4 (d) Nothing in this Section shall be construed to apply to
5 any person who feeds garbage produced in his or her own
6 household to animals or poultry kept on the premises where he
7 or she resides except this garbage if fed to swine shall not
8 contain particles of meat.

9 (e) Sentence. Feeding garbage to animals is a Class B
10 misdemeanor, and for the first offense shall be fined not less
11 than \$100 nor more than \$500 and for a second or subsequent
12 offense shall be fined not less than \$200 nor more than \$500 or
13 imprisoned in a penal institution other than the penitentiary
14 for not more than 6 months, or both.

15 (f) A person violating this Section may be enjoined by the
16 Department from continuing the violation.

17 (g) The Department may make reasonable inspections
18 necessary for the enforcement of this Section, and is
19 authorized to enforce, and administer the provisions of this
20 Section.
