

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**  
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 5. The sum of \$30,843,200, or so much thereof as  
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue  
7 Fund to the Office of the Attorney General to meet its  
8 operational expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30,  
9 2015.

10 Section 10. The sum of \$1,400,000, or so much thereof as  
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue  
12 Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for disbursement  
13 to the Illinois Equal Justice Foundation for use as provided  
14 in the Illinois Equal Justice Act.

15 Section 15. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as  
16 is available for use by the Attorney General, is appropriated  
17 to the Attorney General from the Illinois Gaming Law  
18 Enforcement Fund for State law enforcement purposes.

19 Section 20. The sum of \$10,200,000, or so much thereof

1 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney  
2 General Court Ordered and Voluntary Compliance Payment  
3 Projects Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for use,  
4 subject to pertinent court order or agreement, in the  
5 performance of any function pertaining to the exercise of the  
6 duties of the Attorney General, including State law  
7 enforcement and public education.

8 Section 25. The sum of \$1,900,000, or so much thereof as  
9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Charity  
10 Bureau Fund to the Office of the Attorney General to enforce  
11 the provisions of the Solicitation for Charity Act and to  
12 gather and disseminate information about charitable trustees  
13 and organizations to the public.

14 Section 30. The sum of \$7,000,000, or so much thereof as  
15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney General  
16 Whistleblower Reward and Protection Fund to the Office of the  
17 Attorney General for ordinary and contingent expenses,  
18 including State law enforcement purposes.

19 Section 35. The sum of \$11,300,000, or so much thereof  
20 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney  
21 General's State Projects and Court Ordered Distribution Fund  
22 to the Attorney General for payment of interagency

1 agreements, for court-ordered distributions to third parties,  
 2 and, subject to pertinent court order, for performance of any  
 3 function pertaining to the exercise of the duties of the  
 4 Attorney General, including State law enforcement and public  
 5 education.

6 Section 40. The following named sums, or so much thereof  
 7 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and  
 8 purposes named in this Section, are appropriated to the  
 9 Attorney General to meet the ordinary and contingent expenses  
 10 of the Attorney General:

1           Section 45. The sum of \$240,000, or so much thereof as  
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Child Support  
3 Administrative Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for  
4 child support enforcement purposes.

5           Section 50. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as  
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney General  
7 Federal Grant Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for  
8 funding for federal grants.

9           Section 55. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as  
10 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of the  
11 Attorney General from the Domestic Violence Fund pursuant to  
12 Public Act 95-711 for grants to public or private nonprofit  
13 agencies for the purposes of facilitating or providing free  
14 domestic violence legal advocacy, assistance, or services to  
15 victims of domestic violence who are married or formerly  
16 married or parties or former parties to a civil union related  
17 to order of protection proceedings, or other proceedings for  
18 civil remedies for domestic violence.

19           Section 60. The sum of \$3,500,000, or so much thereof as  
20 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney General  
21 Tobacco Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for the

1 oversight, enforcement, and implementation of the Master  
2 Settlement Agreement entered in the case of People of the  
3 State of Illinois v. Philip Morris, et al (Circuit Court of  
4 Cook County, No. 96L13146), for the administration and  
5 enforcement of the Tobacco Product Manufacturers' Escrow Act,  
6 for the handling of tobacco-related litigation, and for other  
7 law enforcement activities of the Attorney General.

8 Section 65. The sum of \$50,000, or so much thereof as may  
9 be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney General Sex  
10 Offender Awareness, Training, and Education Fund to the  
11 Office of the Attorney General to administer the I-SORT  
12 program and to alert and educate the public, victims, and  
13 witnesses of their rights under various victim notification  
14 laws and for training law enforcement agencies, State's  
15 Attorneys, and medical providers regarding their legal duties  
16 concerning the prosecution and investigation of sex offenses.

17 ARTICLE 2

15 ARTICLE 6

16 Section 5. The sum of \$13,091,050, or so much thereof as  
17 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the  
18 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of  
19 Representatives for furnishing the items provided in Section  
20 4 of the General Assembly Compensation Act to members of  
21 their respective houses throughout the year in connection  
22 with their legislative duties and responsibilities and not in

1 connection with any political campaign as prescribed by law.  
2 Of this amount, 37.436% is appropriated to the President of  
3 the Senate for such expenditures and 62.564% is appropriated  
4 to the Speaker of the House for such expenditures.

5 Section 10. Payments from the sums appropriated in
